GEORGIA ELKS GO TO WAYCROSS

Will Attempt to Get 1916 National Convention for Atlanta.

Atlanta, May 10.—A large Atlanta delegation of Elks leaves tomorrow night on a special train over the A. B. & A. for Waycross, to attend the Georgia State Association, and to assist in laying plans for a statewide and southwide movement to bring to Atlanta the grand lodge and national convention of the Elks in 1916. In the event that Georgia Elks do have the honor of entertaining the great national convention next year, they will have the pride and pleasure of showing the visitors a lodge building in Atlanta that is the equal of any club house in the world, and is universally regarded as one of the handsomest pieces of Elk property in the United States. Past Exalted Ruler Walter P. Andrews of the Atlanta Lodge, and now president of the State Association, was largely instrumental in bringing about the movement which gave Atlanta Elks their new home. Col. Andrews is now taking an active and effective part in the plans to bring the big convention here. In the event the Georgia Elks are successful it will mean that Atlanta will entertain a crowd that will ever surpass the thousands who came for the Shriners of North America. The Elks conventions are said to be the largest in point of numbers and the most enthusiastic of any conventions in the world. The Georgia Association of Elks has a present membership of somewhere in the neighborhood of 8,000. The Atlanta lodge has 1,300 members. The national convention this year will be held in Los Angeles in July, and a large Georgia delegation is expected to attend. 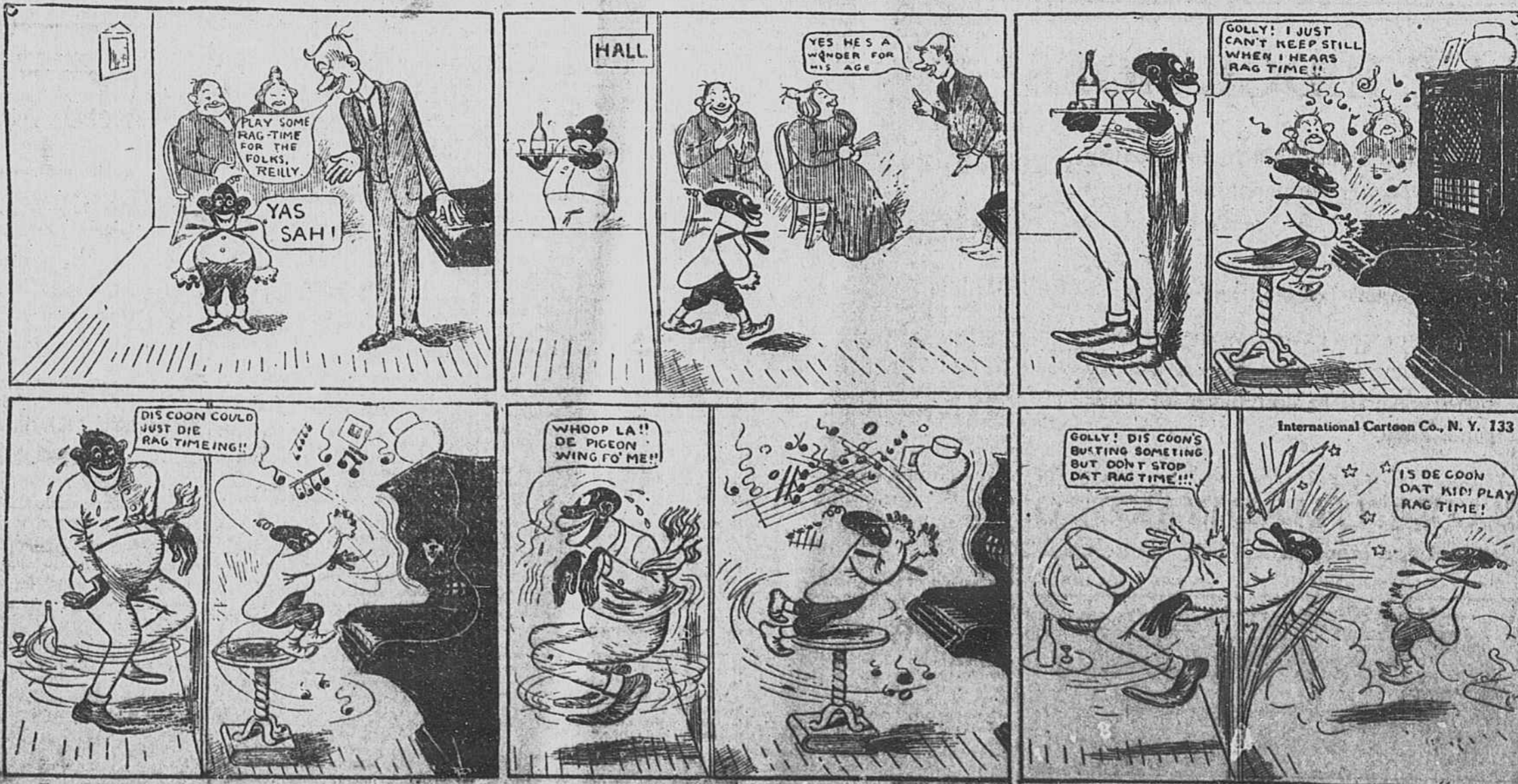
