Gilbert Stuart Combined the Words "Gerry" and "Salamander" in a Cartoon of 1811.

Gilbert Stuart, who is best remembered for his portrait of Washington, was also a cartoonist, and it was he who designed the famous Gerry-mander cartoon, remarks James Melvin Lee in the Cartoons Magazine.

In 1811 the struggle between the Democrats and the Federalists for the control of Massachusetts was extremely bitter. The Democrats had elected Elbridge Gerry governor, and had carried both houses of the legislature. To obtain this supremacy they remapped the senatorial districts, and divided the power of their political adversaries by paying no attention to county boundaries.
