REV. GEORGE T. HARMON DIED THURSDAY NIGHT

WELL KNOWN METHODIST MINISTER OF SOUTH CAROLINA CONFERENCE

ONCE SERVED HERE

Was Retired From Active Service By Methodist Conference Several Years Ago.

The Rev. George T. Harmon died at his home in Williamston Thursday night at 12 o'clock, at the age of 65 years. Funeral services were held yesterday afternoon at 5 o'clock.

Mr. Harmon was one of the best known ministers in the South Carolina Conference and was superannuated in 1906. He served what was then the Anderson station during the year 1873. After he was superannuated by the conference he refused to receive the regular salary which is paid by the conference to these ministers and served as a supernumerary without charge.

Mr. Harmon was married to Miss Margaret Stebels, sister of Mr. R. S. and Mr. R. E. Ligon's mother, in the year 1873. Mrs. Harmon preceded her husband to the grave several years ago. He is survived by four children: Mrs. Peter Stokes, Carrie Lou, George, Thomas and Maggie Stebels.
