ACCURATE MAP OF THE CITY OF ANDERSON

MATTER TO BE BROUGHT BEFORE MEETING CHAMBER OF COMMERCE.

IS BADLY NEEDED

Cost Will Be Great Because of Surveys Which Will Have to Be Made.

It was stated at the Anderson Chamber of Commerce yesterday morning by the secretary that an effort would probably be made either this summer or this fall to get a map made for the city of Anderson for which it is said there is a great demand.

This map is especially needed since the recent rapid growth of the city and the addition of a large number of new concerns here and also because of the demand for such a map by various public service corporations, banks and other businesses, who from time to time find it almost a necessity to have an accurate city map for their work.

The estimated cost of such a map is

made, after accurate engineering and topographical surveys will be very great, but its value would be incalculable and therefore after the preliminary estimates have been made, and a sufficient number of business concerns indicate their intention to purchase such a map, it is likely that the publicity committee of the local chamber of commerce will take steps to have it made.

It is pointed out that Anderson is one of the few cities of its size that has not a regular city map and therefore it is time that the city was getting it.

DEMAND FOR BETTER ROAD TO RIVER FERRY

DR. HAILEY WAS IN ANDERSON YESTERDAY TO SEE MR. KING.

BIG OPPORTUNITY

Hartwell People Want Road So They Can Come to Anderson to Do Their Trading.

Copies of the Hartwell Sun have been received in Anderson containing an account of the Ad Club picnic and indicate that great interest has been evoked in Hart county in the proposition seeking towards getting a real first-class highway between Anderson and Hailey's ferry, which has long been the dream of Dr. W. I. Hailey and other representative citizens of Hartwell.

Dr. Hailey was a visitor in Anderson yesterday and called at the office of Supervisor J. Mack King in regard to the proposed rebuilding of the road. It was stated at the office of the supervisor yesterday afternoon that no action could be taken on the matter immediately but that the road would certainly be looked after in the near future.

The members of the Ad Club are very much interested about the construction of a good road between here and Hailey's ferry and are anxious for some action to be taken. It has long been the desire of the business men of Anderson to have a trolley line from Anderson running from the city across the Savannah river to Hartwell, but it seems that the project has been lost for the present. If this cannot be obtained they are very anxious to have the best possible dirt road connecting these two sections.

As was stated at the meeting at Hailey's ferry on Tuesday night, the people of Hart county and the town of Hartwell look on Anderson now as they used to look on Atlanta; they can come to Anderson and purchase goods that will suit them and know that they have bought the right thing.

It is certain that a golden opportunity is awaiting the merchants and business men of Anderson and one that the river people feel sure will be grasped.

CARRINGTON PLACE HAS BEEN ROBBED

Considerable Amounts of Cigars, Candies and Grape Juice Stolen—Entrance Puzzle.

Unknown parties broke into the store room formerly occupied by Carrington and company in the theatre building and rifled the place of considerable amounts of candies, cigars, cigarettes and grape juice.

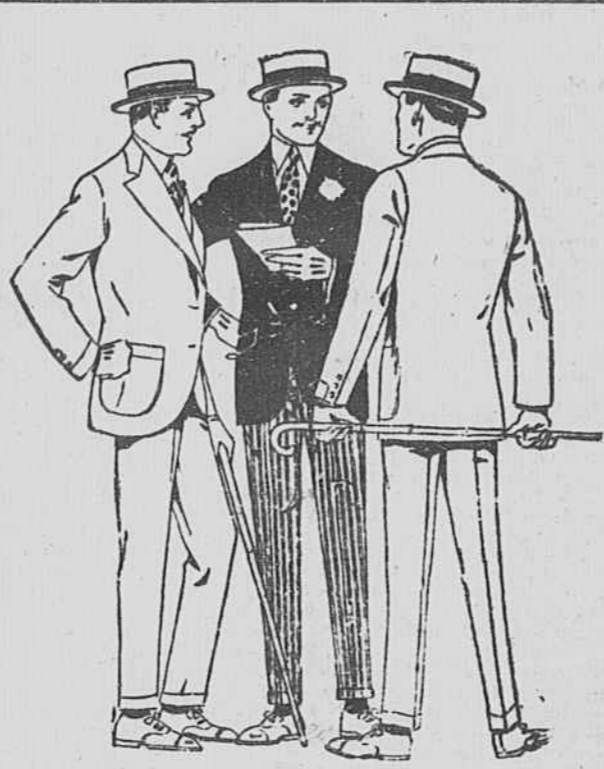
