SHIPS WARNED TO WATCH FOR BOMBS IN HOLD

Hans Halle, arrested last December for having in his possession a forty-pound dynamite bomb, and who was recently acquitted in the federal court on the charge of conspiracy to ship explosives on an interstate carrier was rearrested last night and is being held as a suspicious character until the Howth and Baron Napier are heard from. Efforts to locate Pearce were unsuccessful this morning.

New York, July 12.—The investigation of the alleged conspiracy to place bombs on steamships leaving New York carrying war munitions for the allies is in progress today. Police officials, federal agents and private detectives employed by the steamship companies conferred as to means of cooperation to prevent the placing of bombs on vessels in the harbor here. A special bomb squad of detectives was assigned to work around the piers where munitions are being loaded on the steamers.

over Villistas at Aguas Calientes, according to a Vera Cruz dispatch. It is thought here that Carranza has a good chance of American recognition, depending upon his ability to establish a stable provisional government and to arrange for a genuine national election.

Guyamas, Mexico, July 12.—A general bombardment of Guyamas by the Carranza gun boat Guerrero, planned for today, has been prevented. After a strong protest by Admiral Howard of the United States fleet, and the foreign consuls, the Guerrero commander agreed to fire only upon Southern Pacific trains entering and leaving the city and upon the Mexican steamer Bonita in the inner harbor, which the Guerrero commander said had been used by the enemy for troop transportation.
