HORTON-MARSHALL PROPERTY CHANGES HANDS FOR \$22,500

ELEGANT STORE ROOM HAS BEEN SOLD TO DR. J. E. WATSON

LOT MEASURES 32 1-2 x 106 FEET

Extensive Improvements Were Recently Made on the Building—Others to be Carried Out.

For a consideration of \$22,500, Messrs. Louis Horton and Willie Marshall have sold to Dr. J. E. Watson their handsome store room on the west side of North Main street, next to the Blue Ridge Railway cut, and formerly a part of the Reed property. The store room measures 231-2 feet wide and 100 feet long, the lot having a total depth of 196 feet. The six feet of open space in the rear of the store is taken up by an alley. Recently the former owners, that is, Messrs. Horton and Marshall, had the front of the store room remodelled and extensive improvements made on the interior. Further improvements are to be made in the store room, such as the putting in of steel ceiling, etc. The building is one of the handsomest in the city.

Messrs. Horton and Marshall purchased this property about a year ago. Formerly this store room and the building occupied by the Acme Cafe constituted the quarters of the C. A. Reed Piano & Organ company, an old-established and well known concern which now has quarters on South Main street. The building occupied by the cafe is the property of Mr. G. H. Bailes, as is the building just south of that, used as ticket offices and waiting rooms for the Piedmont & Northern Railway.

The transfer of the Horton-Marshall property is one of the largest deals of the kind that has taken place in Anderson in some time.

FANT'S BOOK STORE WON IN BIG CONTEST

AWARDED FOUR PRIZES BY CURTIS PUBLISHING COMPANY

BATTED 100

And Won Prizes in Every Chance Offered—Contest Open to Approximately 50,000 Dealers.

In the contest for prizes offered by the Curtis Publishing company of Philadelphia for the best window displays of the Saturday Evening Post, Fant's Book Store of this city, battled 100, having won four prizes out of the four chances. MOONSHINERS HELD UNDER \$600 BONDS

PRELIMINARY WAS HELD YESTERDAY BEFORE COMMISSIONER

HAD TWO CHARGES

Against Them and Bond Named at \$300 in Each Case—Will be Tried in Greenville Later.

The preliminary in the cases of Bud Evans and Bill Guenter, two white men who were arrested last Sunday night near Iva charged with operating an illicit distillery, was heard yesterday morning before Commissioner Earle. Bond was placed at \$600 and yesterday afternoon they had been unable to arrange the bond. They are being held on two counts, one on June 25, 1914 and the other July 19, last. Bond in each case was named at \$300 which makes a total of \$600.

These cases will probably be tried in federal court which convenes in October at Greenville. Deputy Ira Wilkins and Policeman Gus McGill, who made the arrests and Mr. McCahey of Iva were in the city yesterday for the preliminary.

FORECLOSURE PROCEEDINGS
Have Been Started Against Anderson Development Company.

Action for the foreclosure of Mechanics' liens on the Anderson Theatre building was begun yesterday. The concerns named in the foreclosure proceedings are: Sullivan Hardware company, Townsend Lumber company, W. L. Briskey Lumber company, J. W. Atkinson & Co., Haulida Electric company, C. M. Guest Paint company, Anderson Plumbing and Heating company against the Anderson Development company, Old Dominion Trust company and the Maryland Casualty company.

The action is for the foreclosure of the mechanics' liens for the labor and

material furnished in the construction of the building and the Old Dominion Trust company is made a party because it claimed to have a first mortgage on the property which is named by the mechanics liens and the Maryland Casualty company made a party because it gave a bond for \$15,000 to insure the Old Dominion Trust company by reasons of mechanics liens and to insure the completion of the building and the payment of in-

debtedness contracted in furnishing labor on supplies for the construction thereof.

The total amount of mechanics liens on the theatre building amounts to \$8,823.
