Chautauqua Opens And Is Big Success

OVER 3,000 PEOPLE IN ATTENDANCE FIRST DAY

GRAND SPEECHES

Delivered by Congressman Lever and Mr. C. E. Bassett—Many Other Things of Interest.

Williamston, July 28.—Yesterday's Farmers Chautauqua at Williamston was counted a great success by those attending and there were nearly four thousand present.

The afternoon was occupied in several meetings on different subjects. A "Soil Improvement" meeting was held in the evening, conducted by Messrs. Barton, Stewart, Chapman and Hyars of Clemson College.

The first speaker in the forenoon was Congressman A. F. Lever. Mr. Lever addressed himself to the subject of a "More Profitable Marketing of Farm Products."

Mr. Lever opened with the promise that for a number of years all agricultural factors had been preaching increased production. "Let's make two blades of grass grow where one grew before. But what value is it to the farmer if a man produce two good ears of corn where formally he has only one?"

roads were throwing them into the water by the car load, for the reason they were unable to find a market for them. The trouble is not so much the fact that the farmers are growing more than the world needs but that they have not yet learned how to profitably market it.

What the farmer needs; and they must work out their one salvation in this matter; is to organize each community and employ a competent man to manage their organization, a man of brains and it takes money to buy brains, and let this man keep in touch with the markets and let him have all the selling of their crops.

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Mr. Barton spoke of the "relation of Soil Building to Farm Crops and Live Stock production." He showed that all plant food comes from the soil and the air, yet the farmer is buying plant food in the form of commercial fertilizer.

S. M. Hyars, county demonstrator of Anderson county, discussed how plants feed. He said that the manner in which plants feed is not unlike that of animals.

Mr. W. P. Stewart, district agent of farm demonstration work, spoke to the farmers on the need of more confidence in the information they have at hand.

Mr. A. H. Chapman, county demonstrator of Greenville county, discussed the home mixing of fertilizers.

Miss Garlington, county demonstrator for the woman's club and Mrs. Willimon, county demonstrator for the woman and girls of Greenville county had charge of the meeting.

Under the direction of Prof. D. R. Whitfield of Wintrop College, the boy scouts were assembled in a meeting this afternoon and after a lecture on scout craft by Prof. Whitfield they went on a hike to the "ole swimmin' hole" where the boys indulged in a half-hour swim.

At 4:30 Mr. C. E. Bassett specialist in Cooperative Organization Agricultural Department Washington, D. C. delivered a masterly address.

Col. E. J. Watson, agricultural commissioner, has one of the best exhibits ever prepared by the state.
