### RECONSTRUCTION MUST BE BEGUN AT ONCE

London, Aug. 26.—(Associated Press Correspondence.)—Already it is time for the schools of Great Britain to begin the work of reconstruction which must necessarily occupy the whole attention of the European world for a generation after the close of the war, writes Lord Haldane in an appeal to the school teachers of the country, published in the current issue of the Teachers World. He writes:

"I appeal to teachers to consider deeply the problems of the present and the future, seeking to know how best they may help their country in the period of stress which will follow the declaration of peace.

"The proper training of the body is no less important than the equipment of mental power."

"I am impressed by the small extent to which people realize the importance of education as a factor in the nation's welfare. This attitude is not confined to any one class, and prevails among members of the House of Lords in common with every other section of the community. The remedy is to remove education from the realm of the abstract, and to regard it as a complex of problems, difficult, it may be, in themselves, but still capable of being solved.

"The war will impose severe restraints on expenditure, but even within the limits of necessary frugality we can do much to establish a system of national education which will have beneficial results on the citizens of the future. Based on sound principles such a system will be capable of expansion and development as increased funds become available. Teachers can prepare the way by training their pupils in a right regard for knowledge, and by helping to get before the public a well-ordered and soundly-based plan of education, simple in its outlines and arresting in its appeal. They may, in short, enlist forthwith in the army of the future the national force must be mobilized in readiness for the day when victory shall have been won in the fields of warfare."

#### Cleaner a Boon to Farmers.

(From The Beeville, Texas, Bee.)  
J. S. Hall & Bros. have this week installed a cleaner in the upper gin, located in Beeville, which bids fair to save Bee county cotton growers thousands of dollars this season. It is a boon to the farmer, whose cotton has been knocked out and is dirt.

Local cotton experts have estimated, conservatively, that the cleaner is capable of saving \$7.50 a bale on cotton that has been blown from the bolls in the fields and beaten into the ground by the rain. This estimate was based on a bale ginned and, which went through the cleaner, Tuesday. The staple was gathered from the ground after it had been blown from the bolls and after rain had partially covered it with dirt. A specimen of the cotton was taken before it went through the cleaner and the sample was examined after the cotton had been baled. It was conservatively estimated that the cleaner had saved the grower at least \$7.50 on the bale.

Taking into consideration the fact that here are a number of the farmers in the county who would not have troubled themselves picking the staple from the ground had this cleaner not been installed, its addition to the local gin is not short of a boon to Bee county cotton growers.

The cleaner was installed Sunday and necessitated an expenditure of \$350. Messrs. Hall announce that they will, as soon as possible, have a cleaner installed in all their plants.

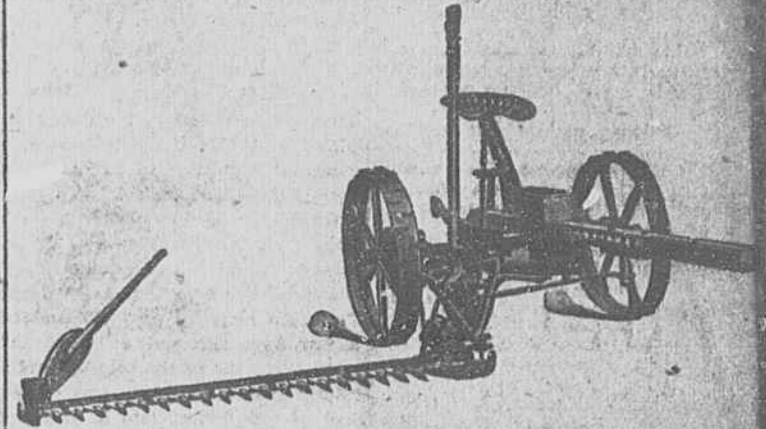
