"ASSOCIATION OF BRITISH" FORMED

Atlanta, Sept. 27.—A "British Association of Atlanta" formulated not to take a partisan stand on the war situation, but purely for relief work, has been formed here, with R. J. McDonald in the Silvey building as secretary. The interesting point about it is that the relief work is to be undertaken right here in Atlanta instead of in Europe.

The work consists in holding out the helping hand to those who need it. It operates chiefly among those who are of British birth or descent, but does not bar anybody who is in urgent need.

A number of prominent Atlanta doctors and surgeons are giving their services to the association, and a number of unfortunates have already been put back on their feet and made self supporting.

Membership in the association is not confined entirely to Atlanta, but may be secured by all those of British birth or descent who wish to join and help the work along. Associate members will be taken in outside Atlanta.
