U. S. HEALTH SERVICE WANTS YOUNG DOCTORS

Washington, Sept. 29.—Uncle Sam is hunting for good young doctors for the United States public health service. He desires the pick of the medical graduates.

"Young medical men between the ages of 23 and 33 will be given an opportunity on November 1 to demonstrate their fitness for admission to the grade of assistant surgeon in the United States public health service," said a statement issued by Surgeon General Rupert Blue today.

Doctor Blue is a North Carolina man; his people belong to the Blue family of Scotland county. He has made good and his fame is more than national-wide. Full counts for nothing in trying to get the places offered.

"There are several vacancies in the government's mobile sanitary corps which is now in the 11th year of its existence, but in order to be recommended to the president for a commission, a physical and professional examination must first be passed. As the tenure of office is permanent and the public health officers are liable to duty in all parts of the world, they are required to certify that they believe themselves free from any ailment which would disqualify them for service in any climate.

The examination is searching and includes, in addition to the various branches of medicines, surgery and hygiene, the subjects of the preliminary education, history, literature and the natural sciences. Commissioners will be issued as assistant surgeon and, after four years to examination for promotion to the grade of passed assistant surgeon, and after twelve years of service to another examination for promotion to the grade of surgeon.

The annual salaries are: assistant surgeon, \$2,000; passed assistant surgeon, \$2,500; surgeon, \$3,000; senior surgeon, \$3,500; assistant surgeon general, \$4,000. When the government does not provide quarters, commutation at the rate of \$30, \$40, and \$50 a month, according to grade, is allowed. All grades receive longevity pay, that is, \$10 per cent in addition to the regular salary for every five years, until the maximum of 40 per cent is reached.

North Carolina doctors will have as good chance to pull down one or more of these places as any other states with as many people.

WANTS TO BUILD DRAWBRIDGES C., A. & W. Ry. Asks Permission to Bridge Ashley, Stone, Edisto and Ashepoo Rivers.

Columbia, Sept. 30.—The Carolina, Atlantic and Western railway, now building from Charleston to Savannah, has made application to the war department for permission to erect draw bridges across the Ashley, Stone, Edisto and Ashepoo rivers, and in order to give interested parties an opportunity to examine the drawings and to express opinion as to whether the bridges would constitute an unreasonable obstruction to navigation, a public hearing will be held at the custom house, Charleston, at noon on October 7.

RUSSIANS CLAIM GAINS IN WEST

Petrograd, Sept. 30.—Territorial gains to a considerable extent by the Russians is indicated by the latest war office information. The Germans have been pushed back from the terminal at Blubokol on the Elyatsyanovo-Glubokol railway to a point midway to the Vilna-Drinsk railway. This represents a gain of 25 miles. West and south of Molodechno, the German line has been forced back eight miles across the Lidai-Molodechno
