# BOTH TEAMS EXPECT VICTORY IN ANDERSON

AUBURN MEN ARRIVED IN CITY LAST NIGHT AT 8 O'CLOCK

## WERE ENTERTAINED

At The Anderson Theatre—Coach Donahue Gave Out Statement Regarding Team.

Everything has been put in readiness for the big Clemson-Auburn game this afternoon which will be played rain or shine at the park at 3 o'clock sharp. Many visitors have already arrived and a jolly good time will be had today.

The Auburn football team arrived in Anderson at 8 o'clock Friday afternoon, and were entertained at the Anderson Theatre at a box party given by the Auburn alumni to the play, Peg O' My Heart.

The team, seventeen in number, and were lodged at Hotel Chiquola. They came with Coach Donahue, who gave an interview to newspapermen last night at the hotel.

"I expect one of the toughest games of the season, and also one of the closest games," said the Auburn coach. "My line will average about 170 pounds and the Clemson line is a little heavier I think, but our backfield is a little heavier than theirs. We are sure going to have a good stiff game, and it will be the best team that wins."

The substitutes of the team are as follows: Line: Sample, Typhen, Sanford. Backs: Wren, Adkins, Eichenbacker. This gives a full line of 17 men for the big game tomorrow.

Tickets have been sold in large numbers. The present indication is for good weather, and a large crowd will be present. It is expected that the guarantors of the game will not have to pay a deficiency, but rather will have a surplus to put in the bank to guard against a game when the attendance is small.

The Clemson team will engage in a practice at the park at 10 o'clock this morning. This will be a light signal practice, and the men will not scrimmage to any extent before the game.

Immediately after the show on Friday night, the team went to bed. Of course the boys are all in strict training, and went to bed as soon as possible after the show.

Mr. Tom Hill, manager of the city street car lines stated Friday that the cars will run every fifteen minutes to the park and that every available car would be pressed into service. Mr. Hill expects to handle a large crowd to the park. He stated that the cars would not run all the way to the gate of the park but would run within one block, or to the end of the grounds. They will go to the corner of the park and the walk from there is short.

Parking spaces for autos has been arranged and it is expected that a large number of cars will be parked inside of the grounds. Everything points to one of the largest crowds and the best game in Anderson's history.

## As Clemson Sees It.

The word comes from the Clemson college correspondent that Clemson is entirely optimistic over the results of the game and is expecting a victory. Dope Major is back in the game and will play in Anderson for the first bag game of the season. Harold McConnell, another Anderson boy will be in the game. McConnell has developed wonderfully both in the offense and the defense work within the past few weeks and has secured a permanent position on the eleven. Daly, a sub fullback has developed into one of Clemson's best ground gainers. He has put on a wonderful form during the past few weeks and is going to make a mighty good man. He may be used in the coming game today.

As for a close game, even the coach of Auburn admits that. It will be one of the closest in the history of the two schools. He stated that the teams are nearer matched this year than ever before, and that the scoring for both teams will be very little indeed.
