Otis Harlan, King of American Comedians, Writes of the Personal Side of Charles Hoyt, Playwright

In the spring of 1887, at the Neil House, Columbus, Ohio, I first met the late Charles Hoyt. It was before I ever thought of going on the stage; I had been in Columbus for the wedding of a school friend.

That evening in the historic old hotel I entertained Hoyt and some acquaintances with some comic "cut ups" for which I had a peculiar talent.

I remember that Hoyt was taken into the Elks lodge in Columbus the night before we opened. Flora Walsh was Hoyt's leading woman and he married Flora on July 25, 1887.

Flora Walsh, loved by everyone, died in Boston while we were playing "A Texas Steer."

Poor Charles Hoyt died at Charleston, N. H., in November, 1900.

"A Bunch of Keys," Hoyt's first success was suggested by Willie Edowin, who in later years starred in "Flora"

an idea and it was wonderful how he would enlarge it. Every time Hoyt told his idea he had some new comedy interest and he built up his plays by telling it over and over again.

I have seen Hoyt sit in our Pullman sleeper, even in the day time, with the window shade drawn down over his head, looking out, but seeing nothing but the funny ideas that were tumbling out of his fertile brain.

Hoyt was a man difficult to approach. His most intimate friends never called him "Charlie." As a man he was cold and reserved.

dora." Hoyt never got a cent of royalty for writing the play.

"A Puffer Ketch" was developed by Hoyt from an old skit called "The Book Agent." This skit belonged to Evans & Hoey. The first real financial success that Hoyt enjoyed was his play "A Rag Baby."

In 1884 Hoyt wrote "A Case of Wine," which was played in Texas by Charles Bishop. "A Case of Wine" later proved the foundation for Hoyt's play "A Texas Steer."

While we were playing "A Hole in the Ground," opening September 14, 1887, in the Fourteenth Street theater, New York city (my first appearance in New York city as an actor), Hoyt started writing "A Midnight Bell," which was first produced in 1875 by L. R. Stockwell in his stock company.

Charles Hoyt had a way of writing about his players' personality and it was while "A Hole in the Ground" was on the boards that he wrote "A Brass Monkey" and put me in to do the song "Rasle Dasse."

Hoyt always produced his pieces two weeks in the spring around New England, then remained for a week in Jersey City, then closed for the summer, almost ready to produce the piece without change in the fall.

Hoyt was an unusual method of developing his plays. He would begin by telling his intimate friends about

Hoyt previously and know that he was not in his right mind. I have seen him shave himself, in his later years, while wearing a hat and overcoat in sultry weather.

Hoyt had a great fund of stories and his humor was wonderful. Everything seemed to strike his funny side.

"A Trip to Chinatown" was Hoyt's first failure. It failed to make any money on its preliminary presentation.

There is no case on record where Hoyt ever wrote a play for a star. He didn't like to write for people he did not know well.

"A Confessed Woman" was written for his wife. It is as up-to-date today as it was years ago.

ORDERED IMPROVEMENTS AT SEVERAL COUNTY INSTITUTIONS

AT COUNTY JAIL

Padded Cell for Insane Persons and Shower Bath Equipment to Be Added.

A meeting of the county delegation was held Tuesday morning at the office of Mr. G. H. Gelfer and was attended by most all of the delegation.

Business of importance before the delegation was mostly preparation for winter in the public buildings of the county.

Another important piece of business transacted by the delegation was to plan for shower baths and a detention ward at the county jail.

Shower baths for the jail were also ordered. This is another feature which our jail is lacking, and which is very necessary.

The improvements as voted by the delegation were suggested by Mr. Albert Johnstone when he visited the jail on a tour of inspection some time ago.

Electrical Cooking. (Wall Street Journal.)

With a rapid increase in the demand for electric ranges for cooking in this country and the work being done by several of the big public utility operating organizations in popularizing the use of electric ranges, some figures from Germany in regard to cost of cooking by electric current may be of interest.

The Siemens-Schuckert company, near Berlin, is feeding 1,600 persons daily from an electric kitchen, and some valuable statistics regarding costs have been prepared.

It is stated that the present annual cost of current or between \$2,500 and \$3,000 a year probably can be reduced 10 per cent when the kitchen attendants became more familiar with the use of electric current for cooking.

Women and the War. (Wall Street Journal.)

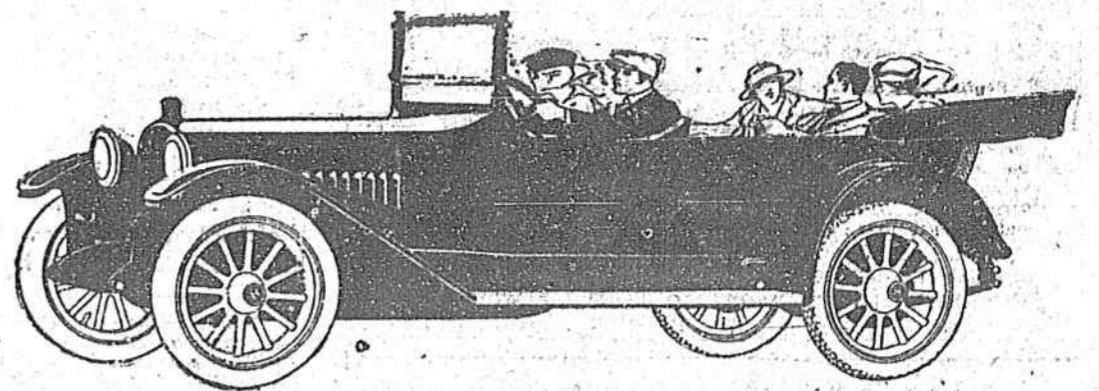
Some men interested in street railway operation have been seeking to find out in what proportion since the opening of the European war women have displaced men of the warring nations in the operation of street railway lines.
