**CHECKS HAVE BEEN PRE-
 PARED BY PAVING
 COMMISSION**
IS DUE TUESDAY
 Amount of Checks is \$16,603.20,
 Which Will Make Total
 Paid \$95,419.36.

On Tuesday, the fourth payment on
 the street paving work will be made
 by Treasurer Ledbetter of the paving
 commission. Checks have been
 made out to the Southern Paving com-
 pany for the amount of this payment,
 and the fourth installment will be
 paid on Tuesday of next week.
 Tuesday's payment is distributed
 among the streets as follows:
 North Main street... \$ 5,408.00

 Total... \$16,603.20
 This will be the fourth monthly
 payment to be made to the contrac-
 tors, the first payment having been
 made August 1st.

**IS SUING FOR LOSS
 OF SON'S SERVICES**
**W. S. EDMONDS BRINGS AC-
 TION AGAINST G. S. &
 A. FOR \$5,000.00**
ASKING FOR \$5,000
 Under Law Which Entitles Father
 to Son's Services Until
 Son is of Age.

Mr. W. Swift Edmonds of this
 city has started suit for \$5,000
 damages against the G. S. & A. railway
 for the loss of services of his son, the
 loss of services being brought about
 by the boy having an arm cut off by
 the street car in Anderson mill vil-
 lage in 1913. This is the second suit
 arising from this accident.
 In the fall term of 1913, the boy,
 Reedy Edmonds sued for damages to
 the extent of \$10,000 in his own right.
 This case was hard fought and a ver-
 dict was returned with damages for
 the plaintiff to the amount of \$2,000.
 This was paid and the case was end-
 ed.
 Now comes the father of the boy
 and sues for \$5,000 for the loss of ser-
 vices of his son. According to the
 law, a father is entitled to his son's
 services until he is of age, and by
 losing his arm, Reedy Edmonds is
 alleged to have become a dependent on
 his father. His father is liable for
 him until he is of age, and on these
 grounds asks damages of \$5,000.
 This suit is rather an unusual one,
 it being the second case to have arisen
 from the same accident. Of the
 accident, little is known except that
 it occurred in Anderson mill. The
 Brogan mill street car, then operated
 by the G. S. & A. railway, ran down
 the lad and his arm was amputated
 as a result of the accident. Attorneys
 for the plaintiff have been made as
 S. M. Wolfe, A. H. Dagnall and J.
 L. Sherard.

Fire in Alabama Town.
 Birmingham, Oct. 30.—The entire
 business section of Columbians, a
 town of four thousand and county
 seat of Shelby county was practical-
 ly wiped out by fire according to re-
 ports here. Advice shortly before
 noon said the fire was still burning,
 and there was little hope of saving
 the town. The town is twenty-five
 miles from here.

Bombardment Caves in Trench.
 Constantinople, Oct. 30.—The Turk-
 ish war office announced a terrific
 bombardment by the allies on the Gal-
 lipoli peninsula caved in certain
 trenches on the Turkish left wing.
 The heavy bombardment at other
