WENT THROUGH 1,000 HELLS FOR LIBERTY

LIFE TERMER WRITES OF PRICE HE PAID TO SCIENCE

SEVERAL TRIED SUICIDE ROUTE

Two Begged to Be Allowed to Serve Out Term—Says One of Those Pardoned.

New Orleans, La., Nov. 4.—"I have been through a thousand hells," sobbed a thin, gaunt man with glassy eyes and skin like parchment, as he staggered into a New Orleans hotel today.

"I am W. H. English, one of the eleven convicts released from the Mississippi penitentiary for risking their lives to prove that an unbalanced diet caused pellagra," the emaciated victim of science explained as he sank into a chair and allowed his head to fall between his knees.

Later in the day English consented to write his own story of Dr. Goldberger's test, which shows that pellagra is non-communicable and is caused by an unbalanced diet such as is common among the poorer classes in the South. The story as written by him follows:

"I was a life-term convict, so when Gov. Brewer and Dr. Goldberger offered freedom to any one who would live on a prescribed diet for nine months, even though it meant contracting pellagra and probable death, I gladly consented to make the test. Freedom is mighty sweet and I was willing to face death to secure it. But I believed I have paid in full for my crime. Nine months of torture. Just think of it. Nine months.

Attempted Suicide.
"Several of us tried suicide during the last few months, but we were watched night and day. At any time I would have gladly welcomed a bullet, but our guards only laughed when we attempted to escape. They knew we could not break out and in our weakened condition could not have gone far if we had secured our freedom.

"I have read various newspapers telling all about Dr. Goldberger's discovery, the triumph of medicine, but not one word have I read of the poor wretches who have been tortured for 270 days. At least two of the pellagra squad made formal application to the penitentiary board to be sent back to serve their life terms in preference to the suffering they underwent. These two were Guy R. James and D. W. Pitts.

"Five weeks ago six of us fainted one day and had to be put to bed. 'To think of eating the same kind of food for nine months. Our rations three times a day for this period was: Collards, hominy, corn bread; fried mush and coffee. This is the food used by the poorer classes down here, and they are the ones who contract pellagra.

Other Food Denied Them.
"We were promised turnips and cabbage a few times a week when we made the agreement to face death by the scourge, but in July those who were making the experiment decided we were holding our own to an extent and these vegetables were eliminated.

"For the first few months I felt only lazy and stupid. Along about July I began to lose weight. At that time I tipped the scales at 167 pounds. Now I weigh 118 pounds. After the first three months I never had a good night's sleeping. It was more of a stupor, accompanied by unnatural pricking of the skin and occasional sweats. I finally got so all I wanted to do was to stretch out on my bunk and think of milk and fresh vegetables.

"I thought of the time when I was a child and was eating one of my mother's good dinners. My visions were all of fresh food. I got so weak in the past few weeks that I wouldn't hardly move. The constant diet put before me almost brought on nausea. My skin became saffron and felt like it was going to crack. We were told to play cards and exercise, but did not have the ambition to do it.

None Stayed for the Cure.
"When Gov. Brewer pardoned us yesterday he told us we could remain in the penitentiary, and be cared by the balanced diet treatment. One might think this invitation would be accepted by some, but not even one of the eleven accepted the invitation. The twelfth broke down two months ago and was sent home.

"We all just wanted to get away from the scene of our torture. The first thing I did was to drink a quart of cool milk, and then I filled up on vegetables and pie.

"Dr. Goldberger told us how to cure ourselves, and I am certainly trying to do it. He said to eat fresh meat, eggs, milk, peas, beans and other vegetables, and you bet I am going to do as he says. I must go to bed now as I feel faint and want to be strong enough to start for California tomorrow.

PURE BRED CATTLE FOR GREENWOOD

Two Carloads of Blooded Stock Purchased in Ohio.

Greenwood, Nov. 4.—The two carloads of pure-bred cattle purchased in Ohio by Prof. Judge O. Williams, of Clemson College, and Dr. T. J. Kinard arrived over the Southern yesterday and were turned over to the owners yesterday afternoon and this morning.

Prof. Williams brought four carloads as far as Sparta, where they were distributed to various parts of the state. Fourteen separate cars were necessary for the split shipments in addition to the two cars coming here. The last of the shipment went to Troy and McCormick, this morning in separate cars.

Aberdeen-Angus and Herefords are the two breeds purchased. Those who are capable of judging state that the specimens are the finest they have ever seen. The prices range from \$875 to \$200 a head.
