COURT OF GENERAL SESSIONS ADJOURNED

ERNEST GENTRY GOT SIX YEARS AND REED SHAW GOT SEVEN

SENTENCE SHAW'S

Five of One Family Received Heavy Sentences—Suspended if Leave South Carolina.

The court of general sessions adjourned sine die yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock and Judge Ernest Moore has gone to his home in Lancaster. Yesterday was one of the most strenuous of this term.

One of the most important events in court yesterday was the sentencing of Ernest Gentry and Reed Shaw, convicted of manslaughter. Gentry was sentenced to six years in the state penitentiary or on public works of Anderson county and Shaw received seven. Attorney for Shaw asked that he be sent to the reformatory owing to his age but this the judge refused, owing to the seriousness of the offense as shown by the testimony in court.

Shaws Plead Guilty. Carl Shaw, charged with violation of the dispensary law pleaded guilty to the charges and consented to sentence in open court. The sentence of the court was that he be confined at hard labor on the public works of Anderson county for a period of twelve months, or pay a fine of \$500, the sentence to be suspended until the 20th day of December, 1915, and then enforced, unless the defendant shall remove beyond the limits of Anderson county, and shall remain beyond the limits of Anderson county.

Eugene Shaw, charged with violation of the dispensary law pleaded guilty to the charges and was sentenced to serve a period of twelve months at hard labor on the public works of Anderson county or to pay a fine of \$500, the sentence to be suspended until the 20th day of December, 1915, and then enforced unless the defendant shall remove beyond the limits of the state of South Carolina.

Columbus Shaw, charged with violation of the dispensary law, pleaded guilty to the charges and consented to sentence in open court. He was sentenced to serve a period of twelve months at hard labor on the public works of Anderson county or to pay a fine of \$500, the sentence to be suspended until March 1, 1916, and then enforced unless the defendant shall remove beyond the limits of the state of South Carolina, and shall remain beyond the limits of the state of South Carolina.

Peter Shaw, charged with violation of the dispensary law, pleaded guilty to the charges and consented to be sentenced in open court. The sentence was that he be confined at hard labor for a period of twelve months or to pay a fine of \$500, the sentence to be suspended until the 20th day of December, 1915, and then enforced unless the defendant shall remove beyond the limits of the state of South Carolina, and shall remain beyond the limits of the state.

Jess Shaw was tried on two charges of carrying concealed weapons. The defendant was called three times at the door and was tried in his absence. The verdict was that he pay a fine of \$100 or serve a term of thirty days in jail. The sentence is suspended on the same conditions as the above cases.

Laboons Got Bail. Henry Laboon and Walter Laboon, charged with murder and in which cases mistrials have resulted twice, were granted bail yesterday for the sum of \$1,000.

Several motions for new trials were made and yesterday afternoon was taken up with general orders. In the case of Sutherland, who had been tried and convicted of not paying poll tax, the decision was reversed and dismissed.

PAVING COMMISSION WILL MEET MONDAY

TO INSPECT AND ACCEPT PAVING ON S. MAIN AND RIVER

GREENVILLE STREET

Is Ready for Acceptance Except for Intersection of Main—Finish is in Sight.

A meeting of the paving commission has been called for Monday afternoon at 4 o'clock at which time the paving jobs on South Main street and River street will be inspected and accepted. City Engineer Sanders has notified Mr. Gilbert C. White of Charlotte, consulting engineers, of the proposed meeting.

It is intended to have Greenville street finished with the exception of the intersection of North Main street by Monday. Owing to the unfinished section the work on Greenville street will not be inspected Monday. Greenville street, East Market, East Earle and West Whitner will be ready for acceptance within the next two weeks and then the only one remaining will be North Main.

CONTRACT AWARDED FOR DRAINAGE WORK

TO L. O. WHITE OF STATESVILLE, N. C.—WILL BEGIN SOON

RECLAIM LAND

This is Object and Commission Was Appointed Some Time Ago to Arrange Contract.

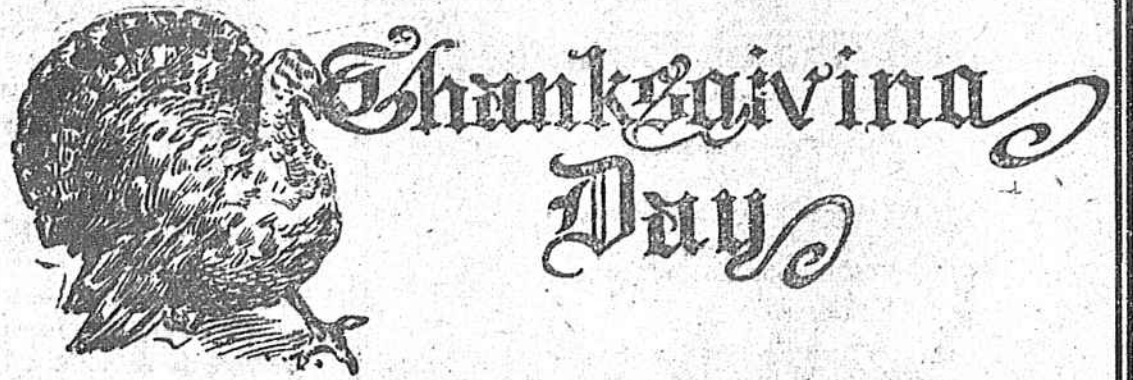
A contract for the drainage work on Rocky river has been awarded to Mr. L. O. White of Statesville, N. C. A drainage commission consisting of Messrs. Z. C. Ballentine, R. S. Ligon and J. J. Fretwell was recently appointed to attend to this matter and for which drainage bonds were recently issued.

Mr. White was in the city Tuesday and while here stated that his drainage machinery would arrive in a few days and that work would begin when it did. Mr. White is a man of experience, having satisfactorily completed jobs of this kind in Roan, Lincoln and Iredell counties, North Carolina. He hopes to finish the job in Anderson within eight or nine months, sooner if possible since the commission is very anxious to have it completed in six months.

Mr. White says that there are approximately ten miles of dredging to be done in Rocky river, beginning at the Williamston highway at the Harris bridge on Lake Beavertan and extending down the river and including its tributaries. Mr. White's work will be confined to dredging and he will not have any ditching done. Mr. White stated that generally he made the channel seven or eight feet deep and 20 to 30 feet wide.
