Peking, Dec. 1.—Chinese women have entered into the monarchal movement with a vehemence which would do credit to Mrs. Pankhurst and her most aggressive followers.

This manifesto immediately called forth a protest from a large body of women anti-suffragettes, who deplored the effort to involve women in the political movement.

These protesting women urged that the women of China have not the intelligence necessary to a proper discussion of the affairs of state and that they should not interfere with politics in any way.

The views of Miss An Shiang-sun and her followers are set forth in the following petition: "Since the Chou An Hui made its appearance, the cry for a constitutional monarchy has echoed from the lips of every body and the whole country has responded to the call."

An examination showed marked signs of tuberculosis, and today little Tony is in the sanatorium starting his big fight that he's ever had before—a fight for health. His hundred seals helped to give him his chance for life.

INDIA'S WAR PRINCE WINS MILITARY CROSS

London, Dec. 1.—India's youngest war prince has just won the military cross for marked gallantry. He is Second Lieutenant Iana Jodha, Jang Bahadur of the 39th Carwal Rifles, grandson of the Maharajah of Nepal.

"During a feint attack north of the La Basse Canal, he commanded a double company with great ability and conspicuous gallantry in face of a severe fire from rifles, machine guns, and grenades and bombs. His bravery was previously observed on September 25, when he led his men with marked gallantry right up to the German wire under heavy rifle and machine gun fire."

The prince is now in a London hospital recovering from two wounds received in the La Basse encounter. He is something less than twenty-five years old.

"I take my men into action armed with kukris as well as rifles," he told an interviewer at the hospital, "but we don't often get a chance to use the knives. When we get near the enemy, they always surrender. They have heard of our kukris."

"In peace and war we keep up our skill in the use of the kukri. At our principal festival every man has to use his knife. We have goats and buffaloes for victims. If a man takes two strokes to dispatch his animal, instead of doing it with one clean stroke, he is disgraced."

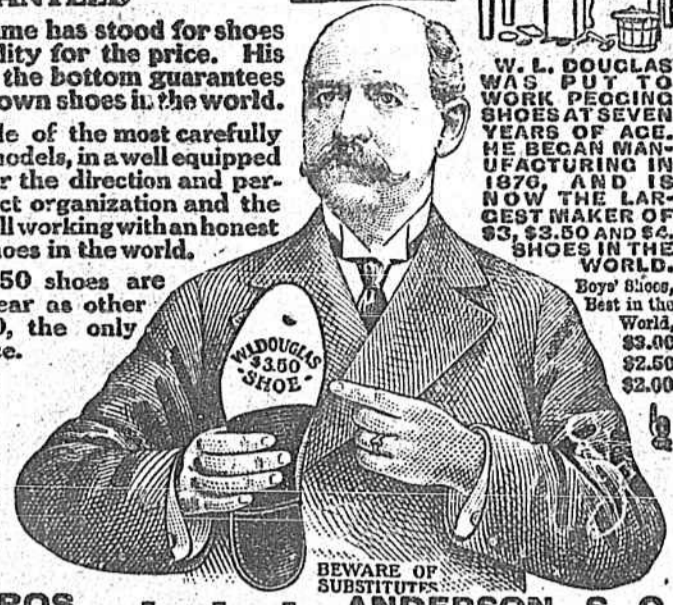
