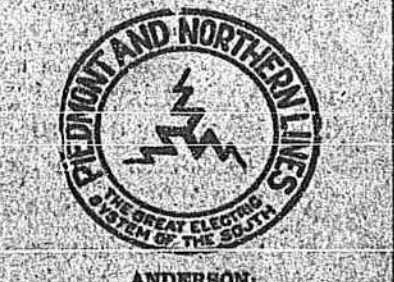

Of the 504 vaccinated, 184 had birds fever. Only three out of a hundred died when treated before they laid the eggs. Of the others 3 out of every hundred died. He vaccinated an average of about ten eggs a week. Many other counties are doing similar work."
