An Increase Over... with standing... Prosperity

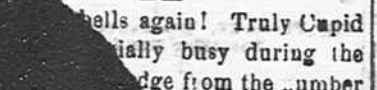
New York, 1900. There were 8,913 failures with liabilities of \$127,184,705 and assets of \$69,119,895 reported to Bradstreet in 1900, a gain of 2.8 per cent in number over 1899, and an increase of 1.5 per cent in liabilities, but assets were equalled those of the preceding year.

An increased number of failures is noted in the middle and western, northern and southern States. The increase in liabilities per cent.
