William McKinley was elected president of the United States... When the electors met and cast their ballots yesterday they made three copies of the result: one copy they will file with the clerk of the United States district court nearest them; one they will send to the president by mail, and the other they will send to him by messenger.
On the 13th day of February, the second Wednesday, the house and senate will hold a joint session, and their presence break the seals of the returns that have been sent to him and will declare the result of the election. The first official result, therefore, will be on hand, I have no doubt, by the time this issue of the paper is published.

THE NOTE IS NOW SEALED
Prince Ching Secures the Great Seal for a Few Minutes.
Pekin, Jan. 15.—Prince Ching and his staff were a long time in the Forbidden City. Accompanied by the chief eunuch, they saw a woman servant guarding the imperial seal. She produced the seal, the papers were sealed in her presence, and then the seal was returned. Owing to the lateness of the hour the papers thus sealed will not be presented to the foreign envoys until tomorrow.
In the American district a Chinese court of justice will begin operation tomorrow. The death penalty may be inflicted for murder, manslaughter, attempted murder, robbery, counterfeiting, looting and burglary, and on boxers who have done injury to life and property.
Owing to orders received from Berlin a hitch has occurred regarding the transfer of the railway from Russia to Germany.
