

Will March At Duke Game

Band Holds First Pre-Season Drills

Band Director Pat Garnett is already at work shaping the University band into a marching unit to perform at the Carolina-Duke football game.

Band members were among the first to return to the University this fall with the percussion section arriving Sept. 2 and 3 and other members the following day. Since then they have been practicing as many as three times each day.

Garnett expects to have between 75 and 100 members when the band is at full strength as a marching unit this year. The marching band will perform regularly throughout football season and afterwards a concert band will be formed. The marching band will be used during the year when the occasion arises.

Pre-Season Drill
Garnett said that this year is the first time that a pre-season training period has been installed and although the band will be playing at the first football game, the doors are not closed and he welcomes anyone else who is interested in playing in the University band.

Part of the band has already

performed this year, furnishing music for the freshmen pep rally held earlier this week.

A veteran of some 25 years experience as a band director in South Carolina, Garnett hopes to eventually have a marching band of 150 students.

The director and his assistant, John Canfield, along with several student assistants are engaged in the task of ordering music, teaching new students basic drill, preparing music folders for the band members and numerous other jobs necessary in the organization of a marching band.

Drum Major Named

This year's drum major is Coel Dunlap. Harry Orr is band president and Eddie Rouffy is vice-president.

Only four or five members of last year's band graduated. Thus, the band is now made up of veteran members except for a few freshmen whom Garnett heard play in other bands and invited to attend the pre-season training period.
