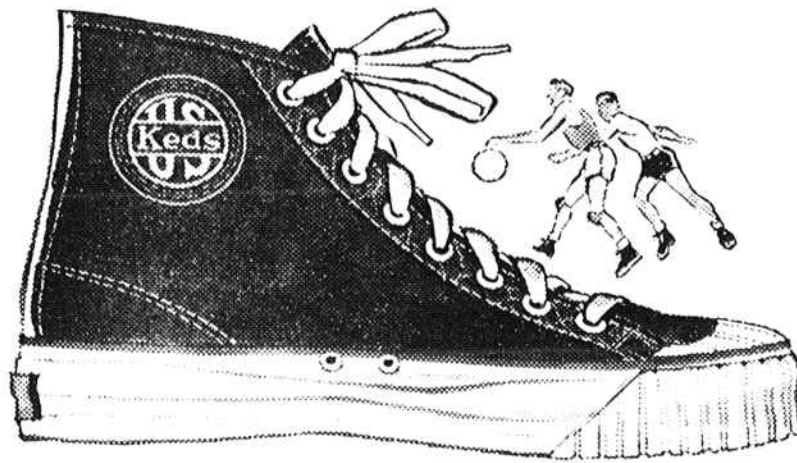

Friday at 5 p.m. was the "big hour" for a number of men as they pledged their favorite fraternities. A partial list is as follows:

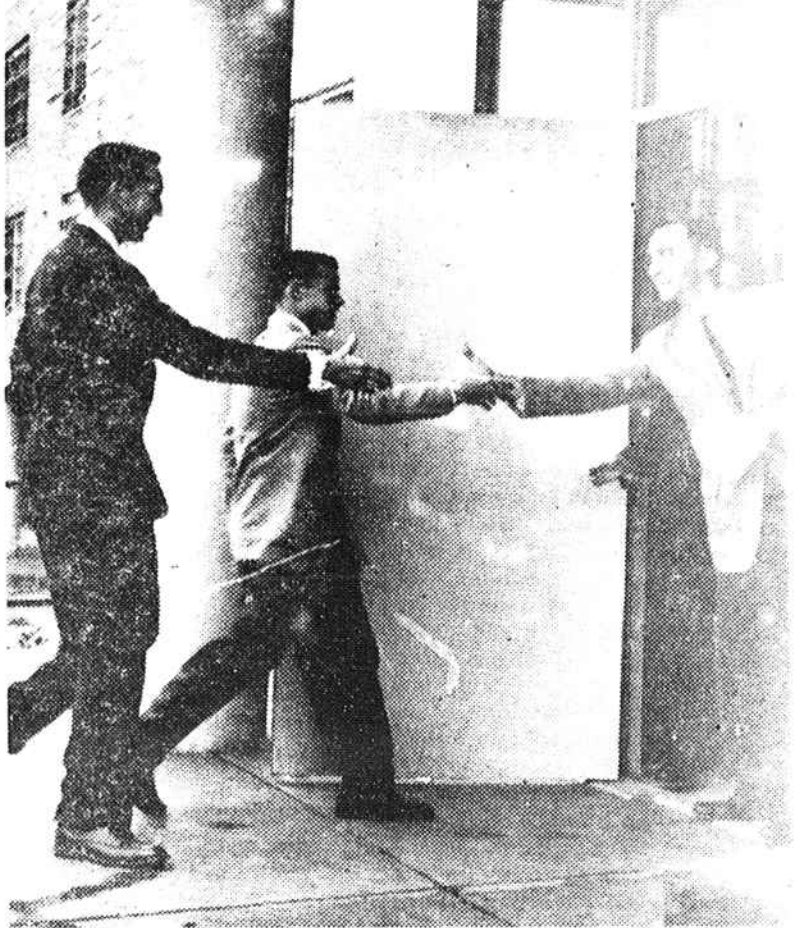

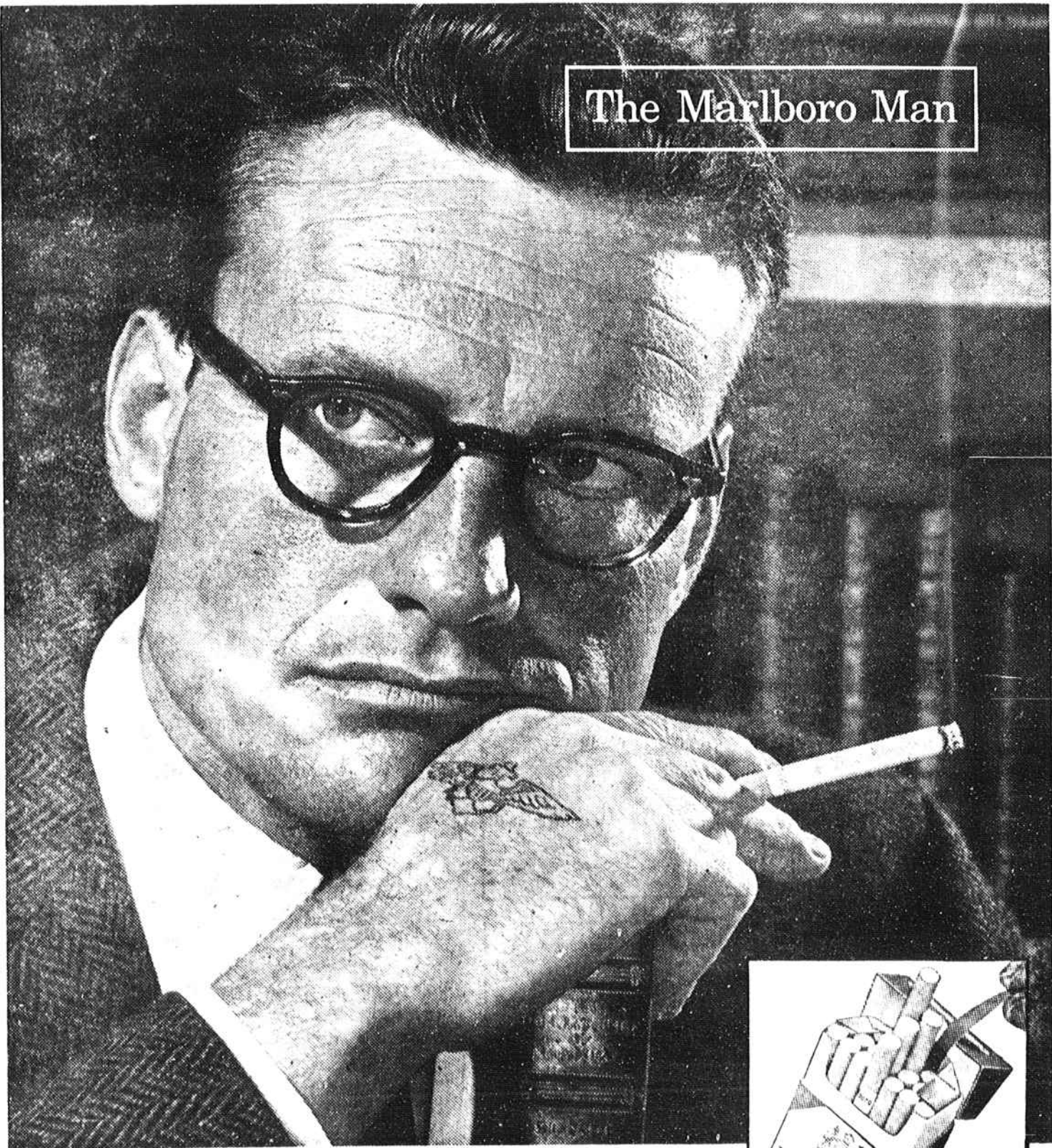
