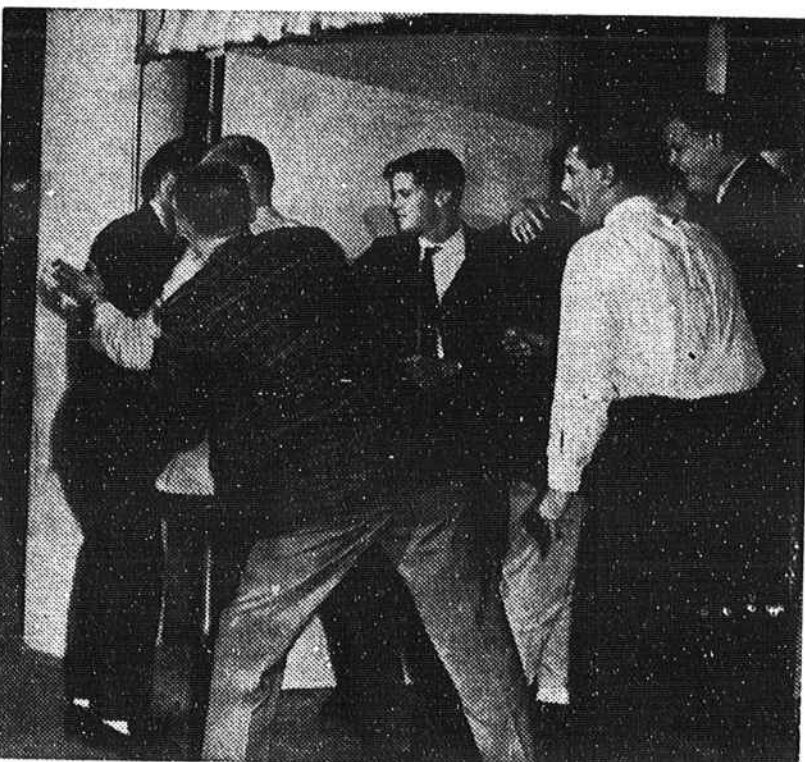

Judith Byrd, who enjoys working with children, says she would like to work in the children's department of a public library. She plans to look further at the opportunities in the library field.

Rachel Anne Kempson especially likes the aspects of library work which deal with research. She says she was surprised at the many activities which take place in a public library. "There is a great deal of activity not realized by the average person," she said.

The Library Intern program, a project of the State Library Board, provides an opportunity for college undergraduates to work in a public library during the summer months. It offers young people interested in librarianship actual experience in all phases of library work.

Many of the undergraduates who have been a part of the Library Intern training program have gone into library work upon finishing college. Others have continued their study of library science on a graduate level, some under a State Library Board sponsored program of graduate scholarships. These scholarships specify that the recipients will work in a South Carolina public library serving a rural area for a minimum of two years following completion of their graduate studies.
