Professor To Speak To Society

Dr. Nestor A. Moreno, former Under-secretary of Public Works and Secretary of the Bank of Social Security in the Castro government, will speak to the Clariosophic Society Oct. 19 at 7:00 p.m. His topic will be "The Changing Ideology of the Cuban Revolution."

Dr. Moreno, who was exiled from Cuba, has been living in the United States since 1961 and is currently teaching in the foreign language department at USC. He holds doctorates in public law and law from the University of Havana.

The Society meets in the Clariosophic Hall on the third floor of Legare College. Interested members of the Carolina community are invited to attend.

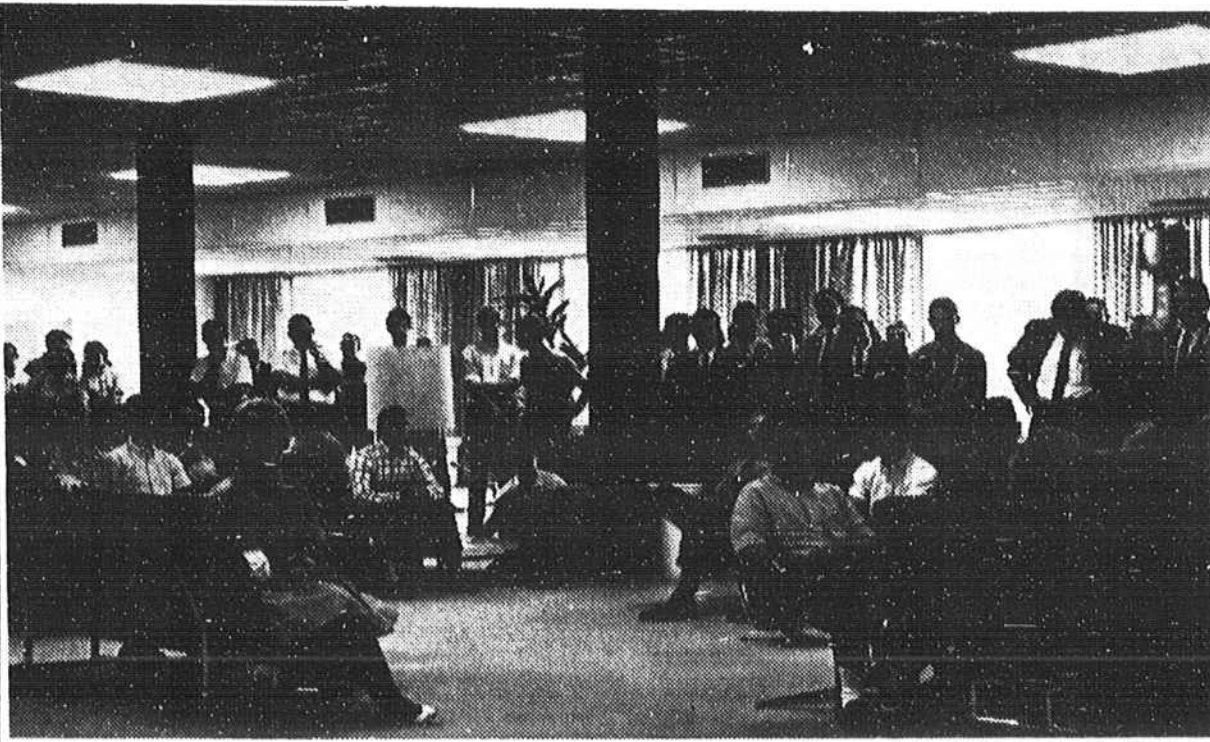

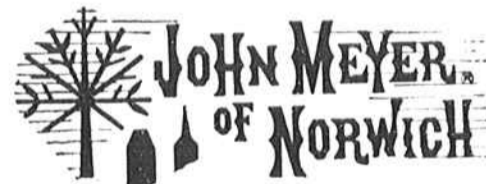
