

Carolinas meet in Regionals

The latest renewal of the "Battle of the Carolinas" shifts to Morgantown, W. Va., Thursday when the nation's two top shooting collegiate basketball teams kick off the "dream" NCAA Eastern Regional featuring three of the top five ranked teams in the country.

Carolina -- which won entry in the regional by downing Middle Atlantic Champion Temple 53-51 in Saturday night's quarter-final at Williamsburg, Va., on Kevin

Joyce's last second jump shot --kicks off Thursday's doubleheader at 7:05 p.m. EST, against Atlantic Coast Conference Champion North Carolina.

Ivy League Champion Pennsylvania -- which beat Providence 76-60 in quarter-finals -- takes on at-large entry Villanova, an 85-70 victor over Southern Conference winner East Carolina, at 9:05.

Thursday winners will clash at 2:10 P.M., Saturday following a consolation game

for the right to represent the East in the NCAA's final round of four for the national championship next week in Los Angeles, California.

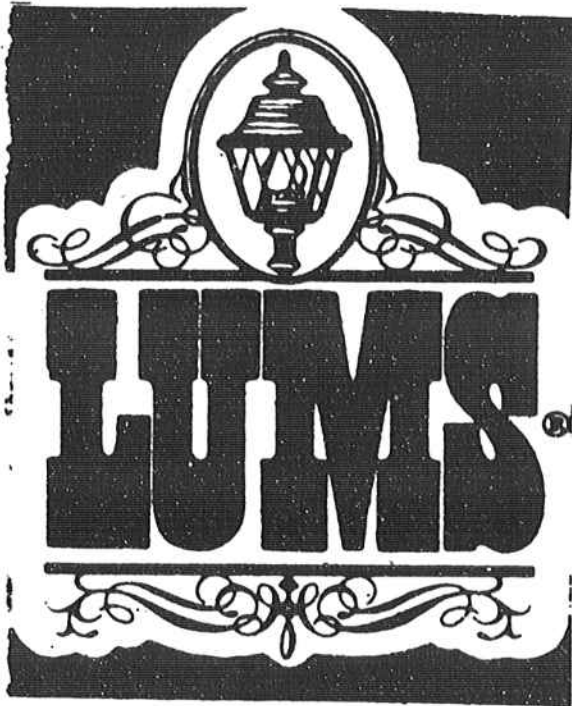
The last time Carolina and North Carolina met was in the finals of last year's Atlantic Coast Conference tournament when the Gamecocks won a last second 52-51 victory to gain entry into the 1971 NCAA Eastern Regional. Carolina has since withdrawn from the ACC and operated this season as an independent.

North Carolina leads the nation in team field goal percentage in latest NCAA statistics with a .532 percentage. Carolina is second at .509. The two teams have identical 23-4 records. North Carolina is ranked second by United Press International and Carolina is fifth.

Pennsylvania, 24-2, is third in UPI. While Villanova isn't in the top 10, Coach Jack Kraft's Wildcats have a 20-6 record including a one point win over Carolina. Villanova also has a

history of sterling play in NCAA playoffs, having advanced to the national championship game last year before losing to UCLA.

All-America forward Tom Riker and 6-3 junior guard Joyce lead Carolina into the regional. The 6-10 Riker had 23 points in the low scoring game with Temple and is averaging 19.4 for the season. Joyce, whose last second 22 foot jumper won the Temple game, has an 18.1 season average.
