THE TREASURER'S OFFICE WILL BE OPEN FROM MONDAY, OCTOBER 15th, UNTIL MONDAY, DECEMBER 31st, 1906, WITHOUT PENALTY.

The Rate of State, County, School and Special Tax, including One Dollar Poll Tax and One Dollar and Fifty Cents Commutation Road Tax.

In accordance with an Act to raise supplies for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 1906, notice is hereby given that the office of County Treasurer of Pickens County will be open for the collection of taxes for said fiscal year from Monday, October 15th, until Monday, December 31. A Poll Tax of One Dollar per capita on all male citizens between the ages of 21 and 60 years, except such as are exempt by law, will be collected.

A Commutation Road Tax of One Dollar and Fifty Cents will be collected at the same time as the other taxes from all male citizens between the ages of 21 and 50 years, except such as are exempt by law. Unless said tax is paid by the 1st of March, 1907, five days work upon the public highways will be required.

Taxes are payable only in gold and silver, United States currency, National Bank Notes and coupons of State Bonds which become payable during the year 1906.

Parties desiring information by mail in regard to their taxes will please state the location of their property, and include postage for a reply, and those paying taxes by check must include the charges for collecting.

Graded School Notice.

The Pickens Graded School will commence its session of 1906-1907 on the 10th of September, 1906. Each pupil will be required to pay a matriculation fee of fifty cents on entering school. Pupils can register, and are requested to do so, during the week prior to the opening, at which time they will pay matriculation fee. Registration books will be open from 9 to 11 a. m., and from 4 to 5 p. m., each day during week beginning September 3 in principal's room at school house.

A tuition fee of \$1.00 per month for grades one to four inclusive and \$1.50 for grades five to nine inclusive, will be charged all pupils matriculating who reside outside of the school district.

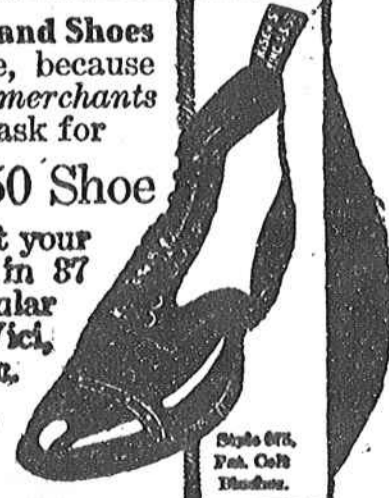
