Those who prefer to do so can pay in quarterly 1910, with 1 per cent additional. Those who prefer paying in February 1910, can do so with 2 per cent additional. Those who prefer paying in March 1910, to the 15th of said month, can do so by paying an additional 5 per cent. After said date the books will close.

N. B.—Tax payers owning property or paying tax for others, will please ask for tax receipt in each township or special school district in which he or they may own property. This is very important as there are so many special school districts. Those who do not wish to come to the office can write me, not later than December 20th, and I will furnish them with the amount due and they can remit me by check, money order or registered letter. If stamps are sent do not send above two (2) cent, as I cannot use them. Please do not send me cash without registering same as it is liable to get lost; if sent otherwise it must be at sender's risk.
