vs Meet a Tragic Fate in Austria-Hungary.

Frankmann and Hugo, two most daring members of the Berlin, have brought the collapse of "Kolmar." Their bodies near Flume, Austria. Nearby was their balloon, a cage rent in the envelope telling the story of their death.

Frankmann had been the third person to insure his life with the newly formed company which takes air navigation risks. He was connected with the charity hospital of Berlin, and Francke was an architect.

Their aerial exploits in the past have attracted much attention and no little alarm on the part of intimate friends. They ascended on Monday from Schmatzdorf, a suburb of Berlin.

Fatal Gas Explosion.

Rochester, N. Y.—Mrs. Margaret Smith, aged 35 years, and Mrs. Minnie Wright, aged 50 years, were killed by a gas explosion in a boarding house in North street. A jet in their room had leaked all night. The landlady detected gas and traced it to their room. She burst in the door just in time to see flames envelope the room. Mrs. Wright in a dazed condition and half suffocated by the escaping gas had applied a match to the leak in the jet. She was found dead on the floor. The body of Mrs. Smith lay on the bed.
