R. M. Hitt and W. E. Duncan have purchased the Aiken Recorder and will take charge of the paper in a few days.

Messrs. R. M. Hitt and Walter E. Duncan, two young newspaper men, have purchased the Aiken Recorder and will take charge of that paper in a few weeks. Mr. A. P. Ford is at present editor and publisher of the Recorder. Messrs. Hitt and Duncan state that extensive improvements will be made to the paper.

The \$75,000 turned over to the state treasurer by Dr. W. J. Murray, chairman of the dispensary commission, will go to the schools of the state unless otherwise ordered by the legislature. The turning of the money into the school fund mean that \$5,000 will be used for a state summer school during the present year, this being prescribed by law. The fund will be equally divided among all of the counties of the state, and each child in the schools will receive about 80 cents' worth of education out of the amount.

Solicitor J. Monroe Speers of the Fourth judicial circuit, has just filed his annual report. In the circuit there were 78 cases tried, 71 convictions, and seven acquittals, four of which were consent verdicts. Only three acquittals by juries were rendered during the year in the circuit. In Marlboro county there were 30 cases tried and 29 convictions. In Chesterfield county there were 31 cases tried, 23 convictions and three acquittals. In Darlington county there were 17 cases tried, resulting in 14 convictions and three acquittals. There were collected during the year sufficient costs in lieu of fines to pay all court expenses in each county.
