

Improved Motor-The motor is of an improved design. cooling is by water pump. The oil pump has been changed to the gear type. The pump is placed in the forward end of the cylinder casting and a fan is mounted on the water pump shaft.

Tire Carrier-Tire carrier is provided and is fastened at the rear of the body

New Oil Pressure Gauge—A new oil pressure gauge has been mounted on the instrument board. Demountable Rims—Wheels are fitted with demountable rims;

one extra rim is furnished.

New Radiator-The radiator is new, of an improved type, and is fitted with a connection for a smaller diameter water hose. Foot rail; robe rail; tilted windshield; one-man top; improved

type curtains, folding up into the top; flags on top of each door for protection of the body and finish; pockets on the inside of each door; kick pad added at the rear of front seat; front and rear fender skirts extended to meet the radiator splash guard and the rear splash guard on the body.


