

The Anti-Liquor League.

Organization Formed to Prevent the Sale of Liquor in Lancaster County--Strong Men at the Head of the Movement---Auspicious Beginning.

In pursuance of call published in THE LANCASTER NEWS of Saturday a mass meeting was held in the court house at Lancaster, S. C., this 30th day of October 1905, at 11.30 o'clock.

On motion duly carried the meeting organized by the election of Mr. John T. Green as President, Mr. Waddy C. Thomson, as Secretary.

The object of the meeting was stated as being to effect an organization to prevent the illegal sale of liquors in Lancaster county, and enforce the prohibitory features of the dispensary law.

After a free and full discussion of the subject or object of the meeting a permanent organization was decided upon, to be known as LANCASTER COUNTY ANTI-LIQUOR LEAGUE. Its object being to prevent the sale of liquor in the county of Lancaster.

The permanent organization was duly entered into, by the election of Mr. John T. Green as President, Mr. W. T. Gregory as Vice President and Mr. Waddy C. Thomson as Sec'y and Treas.

On motion duly carried the President appointed as committee of five to draft suitable Constitution and By Laws to govern the organization, Rev. R. E. Turnpseed, Messrs. R. C. McManus, Geo. W. Jones, R. E. Wylie and C. L. McManus, to report at next meeting.

Upon request of the President, Mr. W. T. Gregory occupied the chair and the following resolution was offered by Mr. John T. Green, which, after being duly discussed, was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, the citizens of this county in the exercise of their right of self government, did on the 3rd day of October 1905, declare their opposition to the sale of intoxicating liquors; and Whereas the State Board of Control has, pursuant to law, closed the dispensaries in this county. Now, with a view of proving to the Governor of this State and to the public at large that we earnestly desire and intend to have the prohibitory features of the Dispensary Law enforced in our county as strictly as any of our criminal laws be enforced by the LANCASTER COUNTY ANTI-LIQUOR LEAGUE.

First. That we call upon the town Council and Policemen of the various towns in this county, upon our Sheriff and all Magistrates and Constables and upon the Grand Jury of the county to lend their aid towards the enforcement of the law against the sale of liquors in this county.

Second. That we call upon all good citizens of the county to give their support and encouragement to our various ex-

ecutive officers in their efforts to enforce the aforesaid law, and to see to it that those officers who will not do their duty, are removed from office and their places filled by those that will, and that they furnish to the Magistrates of the county affidavits upon which they may issue their warrants for the arrest of violators of the law, coming to their knowledge.

Third. That the county papers be requested to publish this resolution.

It was brought to the attention of the meeting by magistrate Caskey that Magistrates are powerless to act in violations of law except upon affidavits upon which to base their warrants of arrest.

It was brought to the attention of the meeting that the "Brice Law" was now being attacked in the U. S. Courts and that in the event of this law being declared unconstitutional it was probable that the dispensary would be re-opened in this and other counties, on motion duly carried the officers of the LANCASTER COUNTY ANTI-LIQUOR LEAGUE were authorized and instructed to take such necessary steps as appeared best to prevent the re-opening of the dispensaries in Lancaster county.

On motion duly carried, the officers of the League were instructed to appoint committees throughout the county to look after violations of the law and prosecute violators of it.

On motion duly carried an enrollment of members of the League was made and the Secretary reported thirty one (31) as having enrolled as members.

It being brought to the attention of the meeting the necessity of having some funds in the Treasury to be used by the officers in bringing about the objects of the organization, pledges and contributions were called for, and Treasurer reported these aggregating \$102.50.

On motion the meeting adjourned to meet again Monday Nov. 6th, at one o'clock in the Court House.
