Great Demonstrations Throughout the Empire --- Scenes Enacted Never Betore Witnessed in Rus-

Russian capital this morning blossomed on with fligs and bunting. All roops were with drawn from the streets and the city presented almost a normal appearance. The nervousness of the people has suidenly disappeared. Workmen by thousands have il ckel back to the shops and factories without awaiting permission of the strike es Virginia Morres, S ella Hood, committee.

Last night's demonstrations continued almost until morning. and Maggie Watson. A procession of five thousand with red flags paraded, singing the "Marseillaise" and moved to the Russian bastile where for an hour they made the welkin ring with revolutionary songs. At Warsaw the military patrols have been withdrawn.

Before noon celebrations began and 'ne city soon appeared to have gone mad. Such scenes were never before witnessed in Russia. Unrestrained by word proclamation warning the Royor deed the crowds did and said what they liked. Despotism seemed suddenly to have been permitted. replaced by license. Red flags were everywhere in evidence.

In the churches devout men higher and higher, and women on bended knees before the image of St. Nicholas, the miracle worker, rendered thanks for the blessings of liberty while at the corners of thronged streets orators harangued the populace.
