

The New Constitution.

We, the People of the State of South Carolina, by our Delegates in Convention, do ordain and establish this Constitution, for the government of the said State.

ARTICLE I. The Legislative authority of this State shall be vested in a General Assembly, which shall consist of a Senate and a House of Representatives. SECTION 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members, chosen by ballot, every second year, by the citizens of this State qualified as in this Constitution is provided.

SECTION 20. The members of both Houses shall be protected in their persons and estates during their attendance on, going to, and returning from the General Assembly, and ten days previous to the sitting and ten days after the adjournment thereof. SECTION 21. Bills for raising a revenue shall originate in the House of Representatives, but may be altered, amended or rejected by the Senate, and all other Bills may originate in either House, and may be amended, altered or rejected by the other.

SECTION 22. No Bill shall have the force of law until it shall have been read three times, and on three several days in each House, and had the seal of the State affixed to it, and has been signed in the Senate House by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. SECTION 23. No money shall be drawn out of the Public Treasury but by the legislative authority of the State.

SECTION 24. In all elections by the General Assembly, or either House thereof, the members shall vote viva voce, and their votes thus given shall be entered upon the Journal of the House to which they respectively belong. SECTION 25. The members of the General Assembly, who shall meet under this Constitution, shall be entitled to receive out of the public treasury, for their expenses during their attendance on, going to and returning from the General Assembly, five dollars for each day's attendance, and twenty cents for every mile of the ordinary route of travel between the residence of the member and the capital, or other place of sitting of the General Assembly, both going and returning.
