

The Labor Reform.

Give below extracts from the address of the speaking men of Charleston, adopted at a meeting held in Military Hall on Monday evening of this week. The meeting was called for political purposes, but the views entertained in regard to labor are very just. We do not suppose that the meeting intended to give much comfort to colored laborer, as it consisted only of white laborers, the black man having no vote; in spite of this fact, the advancement of interests of labor is very desirable, and the education of any class of laborers will do much to dignify the great labor reform movement.

Kidnapping at Memphis.
