LETTER FROM SENATOR HILL—THE NEW REGISTRATION.

LAURENS, S. C., Oct. 5, 1864.

James T. McCornick, Asst. Enrolling Officer, of Troup County. DEAR SIR: In answer to your inquiry, I will make a statement of facts and reasons in explanation of the late order requiring a registration and re-enrollment of all persons between the ages of seventeen and fifty years.

By the laws of Congress, all persons between these ages are declared to be in the military service of the Confederate States. I have between eighteen and forty five are enrolled for service in the field, and those between seventeen and eighteen and forty-five and fifty, form a reserve corps to discharge the various duties connected with the service out in the field.

But the plain fact is ascertained to be that not more than one third of the men fit for duty between the ages of eighteen and forty-five are actually present with the arms in the field.
