Mr. Editor: The Medical Practitioners of this District met at Dr. Russell's Office, in the Village, and unanimously adopted the following

ADDRESS TO THE PUBLIC.

The exigencies of the times—the depressed state of monetary affairs—the high prices of provisions and all the necessaries of life—imperatively demand that we increase our rates of charge.

The credit system has long been indulged by physician of this country, and to an extent unknown in any other business. In our relations with the merchant, farmer and mechanic we are debared from trust or credit. So that our very living now depends upon demanding the same rule of "the cash system," which is required of us. Therefore,

Resolved, 1st. That the following Medical Fee Bill be adopted as our standard rates of charge.

2d. That settlement must be made in some satisfactory manner when the case is dismissed; and that for advice or medicine obtained at the office, payment must be made immediately.

Medical Fee Bill Of Physicians in Spartanburg Dist.

For visit and advice (Medicines extra) in the day.....\$1.50
For visit and advice, after 10 o'clock at night..... 3.00
Verbal advice and prescription at the office..... 1.00 to 5.00
Written advice and prescription at the office..... 5.00 to 10.00
For detention for more than one hour..... 1.00 an hour
Midwifery—natural labor..... 10.00 to 20.00 " complicated "..... 20.00 to 50.00
Consultation Fee..... 10.00
Mileage, 50 cents in the day, and \$1. at night.
Student's fee for use of book and instruction per year..... 100.00
