A Bill to perpetuate Testimony having been

filed in this office, in conformity with an

Act of the General Assembly entitled "An Act

to provide a mode by which to perpetuate Te-

stimony in relation to Deeds, Wills, Choses in

Action and other Papers and Records destroyed

or lost during the recent War."

It is ordered, on motion of J. P. Reed, Solicitor

of the Western Circuit, that leave be granted

to all persons who have lost Deeds, Wills,

or other Records, Choses in Action, or any

other Papers, of which they desire to preserve

evidence, to avail themselves of the benefits of

said Act, under this Bill, by giving written

notice to the Commissioner in Equity, and
