PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency JAMES L. ORR, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the State: Whereas, it is necessary that the laws of the State, with reference to persons of color, should be materially modified...

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the laws of the State, with reference to persons of color, should be materially modified, and that the Courts for their enforcement should be re-organized, so that the jurisdiction in all cases, civil and criminal, may be exercised by the Courts, and under the Statutes of this State...

Now, know ye that I, JAMES L. ORR, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the State aforesaid, deeming it a duty imposed on the Executive by the Constitution in such case to convene the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, do hereby convene the General Assembly and summons the members of the Senate and House of Representatives to meet in their respective Halls at Columbia, on TUESDAY, the 4th day of September, at 8 o'clock, P. M., to consider such matters as may then and there be submitted, and pass such laws as in their wisdom may be considered to the interest and welfare of the State.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the great Seal of the State to be affixed at Columbia, [L. S.] the 22d day of August, in the year of our Lord, 1866, and in the ninety-first year of the Independence of the United States of America.
