

### TAXES! TAXES!

I will, if not Providence hindered, attend at SPARTANBURG C. H. on **TUESDAY the 16th** instant, and on **MONDAY, TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY and THURSDAY, the 22d, 23d, 24th and 25th days of OCTOBER**, instant, for the purpose of collecting the balance of the **TAXES** due for the year 1865, and all persons who have not made a return of their Taxes, are earnestly requested to attend on some of the above named days, and make their returns and pay their Taxes, as Execution, either Double or Single, will be issued against all defaulters, and all Taxes paid after that time will have to be settled with the Sheriff, for I cannot receive any Taxes after the said 25th day. There are over one hundred cases of Real Estate which have not been returned, and nothing but a want of time to issue Double Tax Executions before I went to Columbia, caused them not to be issued. All the Single Tax Executions were issued and put in the hands of the Sheriff previous to my leaving for Columbia. All who have not returned Capitation or Dog Tax are hereby notified that they are required to do so within the time above specified, as Double Tax Executions will surely be issued against all who come within my knowledge, who fail to make their returns, and Single Tax Executions against those who make returns and do not pay. I hear great complaint that some are taxed while others are not. If I can only get the names, and the number of dogs, none will escape who are liable to pay taxes. All who have not made returns of Real Estate must undoubtedly know it, as well as all Administrators, Executors, and Guardians. And I would most earnestly request them to attend to making such returns, and save Double Taxes and Costs. I have quite a number of names and dogs already reported, and I hope that if those who are liable will not report themselves, that others who have paid, and those who have to pay, will report them, as all should be put upon the same footing.
