Managers of Election will be strictly governed by Sec. 2, Art. 5, Con. Stat. S. C., as follows:

Every male citizen of the United States, of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, not laboring under the disabilities named in the Constitution, without distinction of race, color or former condition, who shall be a resident of this State, at the time of the adoption of this Constitution, or who shall thereafter reside in this State one year, and in the County in which he offers to vote sixty days next preceding any election, shall be entitled to vote for all officers that are now or hereafter may be elected by the people, and upon all questions submitted to the electors at any elections.

Managers will strictly bear in mind, that where they fail to find the name of a voter registered, they will allow such voter to poll his vote on being duly qualified by such Managers.

Managers will keep a poll list of all voters in their several Precincts, who vote on the day of election, and return the same to the Commissioners thereof.

Managers are requested to meet at my office, at Abbeville C. H., on Friday, the 22d inst., to receive Books of Registration and other instructions.
