HOW FARMERS MAY GET FLOUR WITHOUT MEAL.

Food Administration's Plan for Those Who Have Their Own Corn Ground.

Columbia, Feb. 9 .- The national food administration has given authority for a modification of the pound-for-pound law in order to give relief to the farmer in South Carolina who has his own corn ground locally. Much dissatisfaction has been caused among farmers, who felt that it was unreasonable to ask them to buy Northern or Western meal when they had their own home ground meal which they could use. There was no protest concerning reduction of consumption of flour, but simply that the farmer did not wish to buy meal from his Carolina. store when he had better meal grits at home.

Thereupon the miller signs a certificate as to the number of pounds of meal ground. This certificate is then filed with the grocer, and thereupon the farmer can buy an equal weight of flour, but in no case in excess of one-half barrel.


