He was taken care of in thejail and a warrant sworn out for him but he died this morning from the effect of his wounds. The negro was known as Lawrence Gadsden and it is said that he had marks on his back of having previously received a load of shot. He had for some time been working on the railroad and he is said to have borne a rather bad reputation.
