GREENVILLE COTTON GROWERS.

Greenville, Feb. 6. -At a meeting of the Greenville County Cotton Growers' association held today the farmers present pledged themselves to decrease acreage 25 per cent., buy less fertilizer and to hold cotton on hand until paid 10 cents a pound.
