Pickens, February 9. - Auditor Keith came in from his rounds of the county the last of the week and says there are so ne very enthusiastic school districts in the upper part of this county.

The cause of their rejoicing is the tax on dogs. In Pumpkintown district, which has levied a special tax of three mills for years for school purposes, the dog tax amounts to more than the special levy. The special tax the past year was about \$70 and the dog tax to be collected in the fall will amount to \$81. This means that there is the astonishingly large number of 162 dogs in one small school district. There are fiftytwo districts in the county, which no doubt will average equally as well, and this gives Pickens county a dog census of about 8.000. This is about three dogs to every qualified voter.

A bill to Prohibit

Dealing in Futures

The Measure Covers Raw Cotton and All Foodstuffs, and Prohibits Use of Mails for Carrying Out Contracts.

Nashingten, Feb. 10 .- In response to the request of the recent convention of southern cotton planters held at New Orleans Senator Clay of Georgia to-day introduced a bill to prohibit dealor unmanufactured cotton, wheat, corn, oats, rye, barley, flour, pork, lard and bacon. The bill is modeled somewhat on the Hatch throughout the country. It defines options and futures declares them to be obstructions and restra ints upon commerce and provides or future contract, as defined, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall ray not less than one thousand dollars and in addition shall be imprisoned not less than one or more than three years. The bill prohibits the use of the mails to any person or persons, corporation or corporations for the purpose of entering into or carrying cut any contract known as options or futures, as described, and such use is declared a misdemeanor with the same punishment as provided above.

Co-Education of the Races.

First Criminal Prosecution Now on in Kentucky-Case Being Watched With Interest.

Lexington, Kv , Feb 7 .- The first criminal prosecution under the recently adopted State bill prohibiting co-education of races in Kentucky is on at Richmond and the whole State is watching its progress because the constitutionality of the bill is involved. Judge Benton at Richmond, Ky., today overruled the demurrer of Bereo college to an indictment charging a violation of the law by enrolling white and black students at the present term. The court holds the law valid The care will now go to trial on the question of fact, which is practically admitted by the college. The penalty fixed is a fine of \$1,000.

The college is represented by John G Carlisle of New York eity, Fuy Mallon, Cincinnati and Curtis F Burnam of Richmond. The case will probably go to the supreme court of the United States.
