Some Recollections of Big Snows Half a Century Gone.

Jonesville, Union County, Feb. 14.—What is the matter with the weather? It is sleet upon snow and snow upon sleet. About one half of the face of the earth is still covered with snow, sleet and ice most of which fell ten days ago. Yesterday morning there was quite a snow storm, after a few minutes of sun shine.

To one who can remember back like this correspondent this kind of weather is nothing new. In the winter of 1852 there was a snow of eighteen inches on a level, which lay on the ground for a week more. Then February 1857, there was a great sleet which broke the timber and trimmed many of the trees of all their branches. The winter of 1856 has already been mentioned in The News and Courier by the Spartanburg correspondent, when the ground was not free from snow from the last of January till the first of March.

The snow and freeze of the 15th of April, 1849, is still fresh in the memory of the writer. So the present weather is "nothing new under the sun."

Auditors Notice

Notice is hereby given that this office will be open from the 1st day of January to the 29th day of February 1905, for the purpose of receiving the returns of the taxpayers of Lancaster County.

All persons having property in their possession or control as Manager, Holder, or as Husband, Parent, Guardian, Trustee, Executor, Administrator, Receiver, Accounting officer, Agent, Attorney or Factor on the 1st day of January, 1905, are required to list the same for Taxation within the time required by Law, or incur the penalty of 50 per cent which attaches in case of failure to do so.

Persons liable to Poll Tax are required by law to make return of same. The Poll Tax of One Dollar is laid upon all male persons between the ages of 21 and 60 years except persons who are exempt by law.

It will be to the interest of every taxpayer to make his return promptly and save the penalty of 50 per cent which attaches after the 30th day of February.
