Birmingbam, Ala, Feb. 21. Of the 160 miners of Virginia City bo enlered the mine yeaterdn afternoon, only fifty bodiob bave been recovered so far. As time
grows, votwithstanding the heroic efforts on the part of the rescuers to reach the entomged men, the recovery already of fifty dead bodies, precludes any idea that life may still remain among the mine this aftervoon wero the most gruesome and barrowing that hav ever been witneased in the mining section of Alabama.
The -corpses were frightfully mangled and disfigured, and udent ification is ulmost imposstble. Many of the bcdies are so bruised wisted and divcolnred that negroe All day long at the mouth the mine were waiting and moan ing women and children, whose elatives were among the unfortu nates.
