Auditors Notice

All persons having property in their possession or control as Manager, Holder, or as Husband, Parent, Guardian, Trustee, Executor, Administrator, Receiver, Accounting officer, Agent, Attorney or Factor on the 1st day of January, 1905, are required to list the same for Taxation within the time required by Law, or incur the penalty of 50 per cent which attaches in case of failure to do so.

Only returns of personal property are to be made this year, and improvements on Real Estate.

Persons liable to Poll Tax are required by law to make return of same.

The Poll Tax of One Dollar is laid upon all male persons between the ages of 21 and 60 years except persons who are exempt by law.

It will be the interest of every taxpayer to make his return promptly and save the penalty of 50 per cent which attaches after the 20th day of February.

After the above dates I will be found in the Auditor's office to wait upon the public.

Warehouses for Cotton

Action Taken at the Meeting in Columbia Tuesday of the Warehouse Committee of the Cotton Growers' Association.

Columbia, March 7.—The warehouse committee permanently organized by electing E. W. Robertson chairman and Mr. F. H. Weston secretary.

An insurance expert in the person of Mr. E. G. Seibels and a representative of Architect C. C. Wilson's office were called in to give estimates as to the insurance rates and the cost of erecting warehouses throughout the State.

Mr. Seibels said that by special arrangements a rate of one-fourth of one per cent might be obtained on cotton stored in well protected warehouses. Of course the warehouses would have to be protected with sprinklers and be of the most approved style.

The architect said that the warehouses could be built 40 by 100 feet, with gravel roof and best pattern for \$1,200, the sprinkler system would cost about 25 per cent more. Such a house would have a capacity of 1,000 bales. A 500-bale capacity warehouse could be built for \$800. If storage for any more than a 1,000 bales is required separate warehouses should be built.

The resolution of Mr. Bennett was adopted:

"That it is the sense of this committee that we recommend to every community in South Carolina where the necessity for warehouses exists, to build these warehouses through their own efforts or by outside assistance if preferred, or if possible to attain them at a cost of from \$800 or \$1,200, with a storage capacity, respectively of from 500 to 1,000 bales of cotton."

Mr. Leroy Springs of Lancaster introduced the following which was adopted:

"That we urge upon the farmers the importance of storing their cotton promptly on being ginned in the standard warehouses where they can get negotiable warehouse receipts, thus saving it from loss in weight and damage and putting it in negotiable shape so that they will not be forced to market it except at their own pleasure, as it has been demonstrated by the action of the New Orleans Convention that irrespective of the size of the crop, by the judicious marketing of the cotton, reasonable prices can be maintained, which can only be accomplished by the effective warehouse system."

On motion of Mr. E. D. Smith this was added to the resolution:

"Any information as to construction or outside assistance can be obtained by communicating with the Columbia office of the Southern Cotton Association."

"Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be filed in this office and that a copy be given to the press with the request that all county papers copy it."

The committee then adjourned to meet again at the call of the chairman.
