The Virginia Mine Disaster.

Last Four Bodies Recovered, Making One hundred and Eleven in All.

Birmingham, Ala, March 14. With the removal of the last four bodies from the Virginia mine today the total number of bodies recovered from the awful explosion of February 20 was swelled to 111. The recovery of the bodies has been a slow and diffiicult task.

The fund which was raised for the relief of the widows and orphans left by the disaster reached nearly \$30,000, and this is being distributed among them in the form of a semi-monthly allowance by a committee, composed of the most prominent ministers of the Birmingham district.
