Newberry, March 25. - Col. Ellison S. Keitt, of Enoree, this county, who was in Newberry today, is one of the most prominent planters of the county. He has grown fifty-two crops on his plantation and has made money on every crop. When asked how he managed to make money during some of these years, when a majority of the farmers were baving a hard time to make ends meet. Col Keitt said:


