Parker in New York.**

The Jefferson Day Banquets—Arrangements Making so That Guests a Thousand Miles Apart May Hear Both Speakers.

New York, March 25.—It is possible that the guests of the Jefferson's birthday banquet in this city and Chicago will be enabled to listen to the speeches of the more prominent orators in both cities on the same evening by means of telephone wires connecting the two banquet halls. A suggestion that such an arrangement be brought about has been made by officials of the Iroquois club of Chicago and the proposition will be considered by a committee of the Democratic club of this city next Tuesday night. Should the local club take favorable action, plans will be perfected to have each guest supplied with a telephone receiver connected with a wire between the banquet halls in Chicago and New York. The voices of the orators will be caught in reversed megaphone connecting with the telephone transmitters and will be heard in the two clubs 1,000 miles apart at the same instant.

Wm. Jennings Bryan will be one of the principal speakers at the Chicago club, while Alton B. Parker will be one of the speakers at the banquet in this city.

Always Makes Money.

Col. E. S. Keitt, of Newberry, First. Provided for the Production of Grain and Stuffs

Newberry, March 25.—Col. Ellison S. Keitt, of Enoree, this county, who was in Newberry today, is one of the most prominent planters of the county. He has grown fifty-two crops on his plantation and has made money on every crop. When asked how he managed to make money during some of these years, when a majority of the farmers were having a hard time to make ends meet, Col Keitt said:

"Every farmer, when the proper time comes, should sow wheat, rye, oats and barley ample for the farm and to give some to spare. When the grains are taken off the fields saw one bushel of peas to the acre. When in bloom mow them down and cure and house them. There is no better feed during the whole winter for all stock. When the time comes for planting corn plant an ample acreage for home consumption and some to spare. April is the best month in which to plant corn to make a sure crop.

"After making an ample supply of provisions for the farm plant all the cotton you can, make every pound you can and sell it for all you can get.

"Every farmer should have hogs, cattle and sheep to raise the meat for the farm. Every farmer should have one or two brood mares to raise all his horses and mules. I had a brother who, from one mare, raised eight fine mules in nine years. He did not miss but one year. Sherman, when he went through that part of the State, stole them all.

"I have made in the county of Newberry, on the same plantation, fifty-two crops and sold them and made money every year.

"Never let a cotton seed go off the plantation. They should all be crushed and mixed with acid phosphate, and if any of the lands rust add kainit.

"If every farmer would contribute from \$1 to \$10 and give it to Sully," said Col. Keitt, in conclusion, "he would put cotton up right away."

Three Were Killed This Way!

The State, 25th inst. What might have been a horrible accident, and was a miraculous escape, occurred yesterday morning at N. H. Driggers' lumber plant in the eastern part of the city.

Will Fowles, a negro, was caught in some shafting and whirled round and round, his body striking the ceiling and yet he was not killed.

The negro had gone up to this shafting, which was placed some 12 feet above the floor, and as he was placing a small belt on its pulley, one of his shirt sleeves became entangled in the turning shafting. Round and round he went, perhaps 40 times. He made no sound, being terror stricken, and his clothing was being torn from him. Finally he fell to the floor, without a stitch of clothing on his person. The whole occurrence took but a minute, and by the time the machinery had been shut down Fowles was on the floor.

He was attended by Drs. Knowlton and Dozier and was found to be unhurt, except that some 10 or 12 painful bruises were on his body and he was skinned in some places.

"I have seen three men killed that way," said Mr. Driggers yesterday, "and all of them had their brains knocked out. This was a marvelous escape."

White Men Acquitted.

Pickens, March 25.—The verdict of the jury in the case of the State against Walter Ellis, Clarence Richey and Walter Smith, white, charged with the murder of Harrison Oglesby, colored, was not guilty. The jury was out little over three hours.
