Lazenster, March 25.-The oard of county commissioners wet here yesterday for the purpose of considering the question of re-establishing the chaingang, which was abohshed a year or go for lack of convicts to keep
up. Since that time the occasion the public works of the county, who were unable to pay the fine ternative, havs been hired vit the Chester authorities.
The sentencing by the court this week of quite a number of con. reted parties to the chain gang, promptedthe commissioners totake up the matter of putting the sys ters in operation again, using the convicts now available as a nuclens
thereof. But several difticulties confronted the board when it be. gau to look into the subject yes. rday.
In the first place, the fact that the county will have no money bis year, which can be used to ay the expenses of araintaining chain gang stared the commisvioners in the face. In estimating the amount of funds likely to be needed for this year's current expenses, no allowance was made or operating a chan gang, and in the tax levy by the Legislature for such considerable item of ex pense, which amounted the las year the gang was worked
county, to about $\$ 2,400$.
In the second place, the board finds that in all probability it will lack something over $\$ 2,000$ of making ends meet this year, any nay, to say nothing about the chargang business. The pros charigang business. The pros pective deficit is due to the fact
that the Legislature at its last bat the Legislature at its last
ession made an merense in the session made an increase in the
salaries of the county officers and igistrates amounting altogether co $\$ 1,250$ but made no provision or the payment of such in crease by raising the county levy, and to the further fact that the expenses of the Skipper trlal will exceed by something like $\$ 1,000$, estimated cost.
